

Driver Pays \$25 For Speeding To Train

Allendale residents, particularly those who commute on the 8 o'clock train, just do not like thrills that early in the morning, and they said so with the result that one Alfred Masterpole, of Forest Road, Allendale, paid a total of \$25 in court last week.

For quite some time the commuters witnessed Masterpole at five minutes to eight come speeding down Allendale Avenue, often taking the corner by Winter's coal office on two wheels. Many times he skidded, while the crowd waiting for the train was held breathless.

Complaints started rolling in, and finally Marshal Robert Wehner tapped the speeder on the shoulder and extended him an invitation to visit with the recorder, J. Frank Rouault.

Masterpole, a comparative newcomer to Allendale, pleaded guilty to careless driving and speeding at 50 miles per hour, and was fined \$10 and \$2.50 costs on each charge.
