

Old Zabriskie Home



THIS WAS THE OLD ZABRISKIE home on East Allendale Avenue, Allendale, as it appeared in 1889 wh today's macadamized thoroughfare was just another dirt road, and today's majestic trees were spindling say lings. The fence in the foreground was a yellow fence on the Ashton property facing the 47-acre Zabrisk farm. The house itself, inherited by the late Albert Zabriskie's father in 1819 from an uncle of the same nan and initials, dates from the end of the 18th Century. It was enlarged in the 1870s, made still larger in 191 and destroyed by fire in 1910.
