Dear Mrs. Wardell,

Enclosed is a check for the
Membership Dues - for our Alendale
Historical Society. It is a pleasure
to be a member of this group and I
gladly offer my dues.

My niece from Ridgewood sent me
a Souvenir Booklet of the 80th Anniver-
sary of Alendale, last month. That was
the first I had heard about the affair.

The picture of Alendale School - (courtesy
of Ethel Borger) - is dated incorrectly. I
confered with Ethel about it and she agreed
that the date should be 1905. It pic-
tures Ethel Harris - as Principal, who
was appointed as Principal in 1905 - after
the resignation of Mr. Sayre June 1905.

Mr. Sayre served as Principal Sept. 1902 - to -
June 1905. Perhaps this is insignificant
as of public interest - but I thought you
would like the information for your
records.

Ethel's other picture of Alendale School
is one of 1898 - (the one you showed me),
and includes - my brother John - aged

6 - when he started "going to school."
He is shown in the row along the windows - scowling hard about something! Ethel, about the same age, is shown in that picture - and Gertrude also.

The article in the Sept. bulletin - about the Peat Industry is interesting. - The experience of Mr. Stirling - Oct 6 1887 was previous to the Apperts in Allendale.

A New York State man named Barth - purchased probably from Gabriskie ^{on E. Allendale Ave} the small houses (third from Thomas property and directly across from what was then the Astor Boarding Houses) and also (2) - 7 acres of farmland - and raised onions on the farming acreage. When Barth sold it - my father bought the house & farmland - as it adjoined the acreage Dad bought from Deloe, and it also afforded an entrance off E. Allendale Ave. to the farm.
