Taxes will be received at my residence at Upper Saddle River, and at the store of A. Debaun & Son, except on the following dates: On Friday, November 27th, at Estephe's Hotel, Hohokus; on Tuesday, December 1st, at Allendale Post Office; on Tuesday, December 8th, at John J. Ackerman's Road House, Paramus; on Friday, December 18th, at Wagner's Hotel, Waldwick. All dates above between hours of 10 a. m. and 4 p. m.

Taxes that are not paid by December 20th will be returned to a Justice of the Peace on that day, according to law, and 12 per cent. interest and all costs will be added until paid.

All unpaid taxes on Real Estate will be returned to the County Clerk as a first lien on the property assessed, on or before the first day of February, 1892, when all costs, fees and interest will be added to the tax.
