**Our Presiding Elder.**

The term of our Presiding Elder, Rev. W. R. Wright, ends this conference year. His noble Christian spirit and kindness in performing his official duties has greatly ingratiated himself into the hearts of the people. He has been a very efficient preacher and pastor, as well as Presiding Elder. At Monticumburg he built a new parsonage, and renovated and improved the church building. At Phillipsburg he built a new church at an expense of \$12,000. At Newton he put \$10,000 improvements on the church. He also built a new church at Washington, N. J., at a cost of \$32,000. He has had revivals on every charge, the largest of which was at Washington, N. J., where 260 souls were converted. The New York University, at its last commencement, honored him with the degree of D. D. The recent district stewards meeting passed a set of resolutions commending his administration. We are sorry his term closes this year, and hope he will be appointed to one of the other districts.
