BOARD OF TRADE MEDALS

The annual medals for the seventh and eighth grade classes of the Allendale School were awarded by President Rudolph at the Commencement exercises in Archer Hall on June 20. To Mary Hutches was given a gold medal for highest standing in history and civil government in the eighth grade during the year. Allen Smith won the gold medal for highest standing in history in the seventh grade. A special prize of \$5 for the best essay on "What Allendale Citizens Can do for Allendale" was divided between Gillette Clark and Mary Robinson. The Judges were Dr. Woodruff, Mayor Nadler and President Rudolph.

The Board of Trade's special task of supplying cigarettes and candy to passing soldiers in the truck trains on the turnpike is in charge of Mrs. A. B. Sullivan. All contributions to the fund and all donations of tobacco and candy should be sent to her. Already some of the children of the town are making candy for this purpose.

Fourth of July will be a big day in Allendale if all the people will help make it so. By request of the President and Governor we will have a patriotic celebration. At 2 o'clock, there will be a parade of all military, patriotic and other organizations headed by the 49th Infantry Band from Camp Merritt. At 3 o'clock there will be patriotic exercises at Recreation Park. The principal speaker will be Forrest Edwards of Chatham, N. J., of the New Jersey Defense Council. At four o'clock there will be a baseball game between the Camp Merritt nine and Allendale. Accompanying the ball team and the band there will be at least 50 other soldiers. These will be entertained at dinner by Allendale residents. In the evening, at Borough hall, there will be a dance for our soldier guests. Automobile owners have volunteered to transport the soldiers to and from Camp Merritt. Anyone who will entertain one or more soldiers should notify J. H. Robertson, publicity chairman, at once. It will be a "good-by" entertainment, for most of these men sail for France soon.
