## DOING A GOOD WORK

Praise of the community is due the young Allendale Ambulance Corps, which answered about 21 calls from August 1 to January 1.

Organized by Police Commissioner J. P. Doehling when the ambulance was procured by the town last summer, the corps has been functioning quietly with Carl Wehner as president and Paul D. O'Connor as captain. The ambulance has been called out 16 times, the remainder of the cases being of first aid or blood transfusion type where use of the ambulance was not needed. The corps has 18 members.

Every Monday night a drill is held by the Corps. Members are now receiving instruction from Mr. O'Connor on the standard first aid course, after which the advanced course will be taken up. Each night of the week two members are assigned for ambulance duty. The list with names of members on call any particular night is available in advance at the Police Headquarters and three other points. Upon the men assigned each day rests the responsibility of seeing that fresh water is placed daily in the hot and cold thermos jugs in the ambulance. During the day the police have names of about five members always available for calls. On Sundays and holidays two men are assigned to duty during the day and must agree to stay in town ready to receive calls at their home. Once each month three members attend the meeting of the New Jersey First Aid Council, held at various parts of the state, Allendale corps having affiliated with this state organization. Attendance at meetings and drills is nearly always 100 percent.

Thus has considerable been accomplished and is being accomplished by men who have volunteered their services to come to the aid of others. The captain, president and members deserve high praise for their work and consideration to their requests.
