President Wehner Explains Set-Up After Incorporation

President Carl T. Wehner of the Ambulance Corps announced this morning that incorporation papers have been filed for the Corps, and explained that under the new arrangement no fee will be charged for transportation to or from hospitals for any of the five towns on the Corps list.

Postmaster John J. Kelly prepared the incorporation papers, and Wehner said that Recorder Lester J. Richardson had filed the papers with the County Clerk, a duplicate being forwarded to the Secretary of State. When receipt of the papers by the state is acknowledged, the incorporation will be completed. Under incorporation the 19 members of the group will be trustees.

Explaining that there is no charge for out-of-town residents' use of the Corps services in any of the five municipalities, Wehner said, "We have dedicated ourselves to provide service for Allendale, Waldwick, Saddle River Borough, Upper Saddle River Borough and Ramsey. The residents of all these towns contributed to help purchase our new \$3,500 ambulance. No charge will be made for transportation cases between these towns and local hospitals, and the ambulance will quickly respond to calls from doctors, or, in cases of emergency, police officers and citizens."

The easiest way to get the ambulance is to ask the telephone operator for the Allendale police, stating the location and nature of the call. The police desk marshal will then relay the call to those corps members who are assigned to answer calls during that particular time. He said every member knows his duty and his schedule of assignment, so there will be no confusion or delay.
