



A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH

Methodism came to this part of New Jersey about one hundred and fifty years ago. The church records of the New Prospect M. E. Church, now Waldwick, begin with the year 1797. The Rev. John Fountain was the first pastor. He and his associate covered a circuit of stations and churches from Haverstraw to Belleville.

From the New Prospect Church have gone out six other churches and one of these was Archer Memorial. A Sunday School had been meeting in the home of one of the members for several years in Allendale preceding 1876. Mr. O. H. P. Archer had purchased a summer home in Allendale in 1869. Finding it inconvenient to attend the New Prospect Church regularly, he made plans and built the

first memorial chapel in Allendale in 1876. On Sunday, February 17, 1876 at 3 p. m., a Sunday School opening was held in the new room and on June 8, 1876 the dedicatory services as a church were held, Bishop E. S. Janes, officiating. The Rev. R. B. Collins was then the pastor. For the ensuing ten years, regular services were held in the chapel by the pastor appointed to the New Prospect Church. But starting in 1886, the Bishop appointed a pastor who lived in Allendale.

In 1893, Mr. Archer desired to make improvements in the church building, as it was a memorial to his parents and the community needed a larger edifice. He stated his design to the Conference and the Rev. George F. Dickinson was appointed pastor. In October of 1893 an announcement was made that the Archer Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church having been enlarged and beautified would be open for Divine Service, November 5, 1893. No money was solicited to pay off a debt as there was none. All of the expenses were met by Mr. Archer, who called it a "Freewill memorial offering to the Lord." Dr. Henry A. Buttz of Drew Seminary preached at the morning

service and in the evening several visiting Methodist clergymen gave brief addresses of felicity and joy to a crowded church auditorium.

The three large memorial windows are in memory of Jonathan and Hannah Archer, the godly parents of O. H. P. Archer and of Dr. William P. Abbott, his son-in-law, widely known and beloved Methodist clergyman.

Archer Hall was built before 1886 as the records of the Official Board state that they were holding their meetings in the Hall. The present parsonage was built about 1893. Mrs. O. H. P. Archer and


her children continued to be active workers and show a great interest in the church after the death of her husband in 1899. In 1901, she presented Archer Hall, the parsonage and about two acres of ground to the Church Society. Electric lights were put in Archer Hall in the summer of 1903 through the joint efforts of Mrs. Archer and the congregation. A reception was given to the Rev. and Mrs. William A. Knox and family on May 2, 1903. After a musical program, addresses of welcome were made by James Hubbard, Superintendent of the Sunday School and the Rev. Jackson, Rector of Epiphany Episcopal Church.

The new Moeller Organ was built and dedicated on Sunday, November 11, 1923 during the pastorate of the Rev. C. S. Woodruff.

Mrs. Gilbert E. Nichols was the organist and director of the choir. The fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the church was observed during the pastorate of the Rev. J. C. Hofer with Dr. E. E. Pearce and Rev. C. C. Woodruff as special speakers. Ten years later a Jubilee Month was observed under the leadership of the Rev. George F. Storey and in 1941 the 65th anniversary of the founding of the church was observed in a banquet and special Sunday services at which Dr. Lloyd C. Wicke and the Rev. J. C. Hofer were speakers.

It would be impossible to write even a brief history of this Church without paying tribute to the devoted and sacrificial efforts of the women who gave so freely of their time and talent to the support of the Church. When anyone spends a few hours looking

over the old records of the Church and Church Aid Society, he begins to sense the great devotion and love of the Church felt by the founders and members in those early days. Life was more simple then and the Church was the social as well as the religious center. But the purpose for which the church exists, the witnessing to the grace and power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, is needed today as much or more than ever before. The growth of the Church and the Kingdom of God depends upon the free and glad self-giving of time, talents, possessions, ability to lead and ability to serve, by Christian men and women.

Many repairs and improvements have been made on the church buildings from time to time. Right now, the Official Board is undertaking several needed repairs and improvements and is asking the cooperation of all of the membership in taking care of these projects.

For seventy years Archer Memorial Methodist Church has held aloft the banner of the Cross as the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth through the love and labors of faithful fathers, devoted women, worthy ministers and loyal members who have rejoiced in the service and success of the Gospel in this region.

WOMAN'S SOCIETY OF CHRISTIAN SERVICE

In 1878 the first organization of a small group of Christian women was known as Archer Ladies Aid Society.

The first President was Mrs. Henry Mallinson, whose son was the husband of our Mrs. Mae Mallinson.

Mr. Archer felt these women needed a place to hold their meetings, fairs, etc., so in due time he had built Archer Hall, with the cooperation of the Official Board.

The "Annual Fair" was a great event in those happy days, and much time and thought through the year was given to make it a splendid "Fair." For years the date was set for the full of the moon in August, to insure good weather and plenty of light for the friends and neighbors for miles around to drive to Archer Hall, Allendale. It was a big event with its splendid "supper" in those days, but really a wonderful dinner, and the beautifully trimmed and attractive booths.

In 1912 the name was changed to the Church Aid Society, when Dr. Woodruff was the pastor.

Again in 1940 the name was changed to the Woman's Society for Christian Service, when the conference reorganized all women's societies in the Methodist Church.

Mrs. Preston was the first president. She served two years. Mrs. Beswick followed for two years.

Mrs. Harold Scott was elected for her second year, but had to resign as she was moving to Florida.

Our first vice-president, Mrs. Hazel Turner, is now our acting president.

We have five groups in our W. S. C. S.

Mrs. A. N. Anderson is chairman of the first group. .

Mrs. Florence Bohr is chairman of the second group.

Mrs. R. Haythorn is chairman of the third group.

Mrs. Frank Winters is chairman of the fourth group.

And last but by no means least is our very splendid group of young women, the Evening Circle, with Mrs. Henry Forshay, president.

THE THIMBLE CLUB

In 1924, about the time the new organ was installed, twelve women banded tagether, calling themselves The Thimble Club, to raise \$50 toward the payment of the organ.

After the \$50 was paid, we had enjoyed being together so much, we decided to meet once a month, each paying fifty cents. Another \$50 was raised for chairs in Archer Hall and for a good many years we have contracted to pay \$32 a year to have the organ tuned quarterly, and often there is additional work to be done.

In recent years we have given \$25 for the furnace, \$25 for the Church Crusade for Christ and \$25 for the painting of the Church.

We have raised just about \$1,500, most of which has been given to the work of the Church. This is what makes us an unusual and happy organization.

THE METHODIST YOUTH FELLOWSHIP

The first young people's organization in the Methodist Church was called the Christian Endeavor, and later this was changed to an Epworth League. It was a flourishing organization of the younger and middle aged adults. The devotional meetings were held Sunday evenings and the social activities between Sundays. These included many kinds of parties and rallies with other chapters in nearby towns. It was a flexible organization that gave a valuable Christian training in worship, missionary eduction and community service to a great number of young people and adults. However, its main contribution was in the development of the moral and spiritual life of young people in their most receptive and decisive years. Some of the leaders of the organization through the years were Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Hillman, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Anderson, Mr. and Mrs. Robert McNeil, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Phair, Miss Mary Hobbard, Mrs. Sadie Winans, Mrs. Gertrude Atkinson, John Van Horn, Miss Gussie Pownall and Mr. and Mrs. Starbuck.

The Allendale Epworth League always sent a large delegation to the Summer Institute held for years on the Drew campus and recently at Blair Academy in Blairstown. For several years in the late thirties, the Epworth League presented an enjoyable local talent play each year to an enthusiastic audience.

After the merger of the three national Methodist Churches, the name Enworth League was changed to Methodist Youth Fellowship in 1941. The spirit and purpose of the Enworth League continued but the Fellowship is more closely graded into Intermediate, Senior and Young Adult groups. Archer Church has a combined Intermediate and Senior group, ages 14 to 18, that carry out a program of religious services and social activities. The Proof has usually been counsellor of the Fellowship and during the past year Miss Ethel Winter has been the leader in planning the Sunday evening services. The Fellowship welcomes all young people who attend high school or of that age group.

The Men's Club was organized in 1939 with Wilfred Paulsen as President, to promote a spirit of sociability, hobbys, and comradeship among the men of our Church and our community. The success of the Club since it resumed its activities has been largely due to the unselfish and untiring efforts of those who had charge of the work in hand, including Frenk Berdan, Chairman of the ticket committee, and Ed Hamilton, in charge of group singing.

HISTORY OF SCOUTING IN ALLENDALE

Scouting was first organized in Allendale in late 1916. The first Troop was organized with the Rev. Charles Woodruff as Chairman of the Troop Committee and his associates were Willard Alling, Arthur Tomalin, Harry Hartt and A. E. Atkinson. Robert A. Phar was the first Scout Master. The Troop was active in World War 1, selling War Bonds and collecting waste paper.

In the early days of Scouting all Troops were directed from National Headquarters, and as the movement grew it was found that smaller directing units were needed so the county was divided up into regions and councils. Allendale was made a member of North Bergen County Council and the Troop number was changed from 1 to 59. This breaking down into smaller units helped greatly because Troops could compete with each other through organized activities conducted by the Council.

The following men have served as Scout Masters since the start of Scouting: Robert A. Phair, Harry C. Hartt, Daniel L. Dargue, Walter R. Hillman, Jonas C. Clain, George Price, Frederick L. Savage, Harry M. Lampa, Elwood T. Critchley, Arthur A. Albert, and William B. Buhlman.

Except for a very few years, Scouting in Allendale has always been sponsored by the Archer Memorial Church. During the last few years the Church has been very generous in allowing the use of Archer Hall for Scouting purposes, and Rev. Herbert A. Sawyer has given a large portion of his time to Scouting, particularly in the organization of the Cub Pack and the new Senior Scout Unit.

The highest rank in Scouting is that of Eagle Scout. The following members of Troop 59 have reached Eagle rank—Norman Farrell, David Kaplan, Charles Buchholtz, Daniel Hamilton, Robert Simpson, Bradley Dargue, Robert Roswell, John Hover, Robert Secor, Richard Davis, William McPeek, Samuel Pritchett and the Scout Master, William Buhlman.

During World War II, Troop 59 was one of the first Troops to start collecting all sorts of salvage material for war use—paper 409,405 pounds, metal 24,000 pounds, rubber 4,000 pounds, aluminum 2,000 pounds. Nineteen members of the Troop qualified for the General Eisenhower medal for collecting 1,000 pounds of paper during the months of March and April 1945. The following members of the Troop served in the armed forces: Arthur H. Albert, David Berdan, Norman Farrell, David Kaplan, Arthur Lamb, Samuel M. Phitchett, Harold W. Scott, Jr., Harry M. Lampa, James Hummer, John Breads, John Strangfeld, Edward Hamilton, Martin P. Hamilton, Ray V. Jones, Jr., Russell Jenkins, William Phair, Herbert W. Flandreau, Jr., and Robert McPeek. Since the end of the war Robert Roswell, Charles Buchholtz, Bradley Dargue and Robert Simpson have entered the service. The Troop observed its 25th Anniversary in May, 1945.

Members of the Troop Committee are: L. R. McPeek, Norman Kershaw, Roy Quackenbush, John Gasko, Harvey W. Beswick and Rev. Herbert A. Sawyer. The new leaders of the Troop are David Kaplan, Scout Master and James Hummer, Assistant Scout Master.

During 1940 a few of the younger boys in town expressed a desire to be members of a Cub Pack. Cubbing is for boys of 9 to 11 years of age. After a series of meetings with the parents of the boys the Pack was organized on May 30th, 1943 with Frederick Hasenbalg as Cub Master. After a year Harvey Beswick became Cub Master.

HISTORY OF SCOUTING-Continued

During the past two years the Pack has graduated twelve boys into Troop 59 and during the coming year approximately sixteen boys will be graduated. The present Pack Committee is made up of John H. Tucker, Thorleif Berntsen, William Anderson, Hadley Ford, Arden Bradley, William Dunsby and Leslie Johnson. The Den Mothers are Mrs. Edwin Grossman, Mrs. Leslie Hudson, Mrs. Edwin Hall and Mrs. John H. Tucker. Members of the Boy Scout Troop are assigned to the Pack to serve as Den Chiefs and at the present the following Scouts are acting as Den Chiefs: Wayne Beswick, Roderick Morgan, Arthur Davis and James Ferenbach.

Recently a demand has risen for the formation of a Senior Scout Unit for the toys fifteen years of age to eighteen. After several meetings with Paul A. Clundt, Field Executive, the Unit Committee of Joseph H. Stehn, Chairman, Russel N. Jenkins, Frank A. Farrell, Robert W. Cunningham, James W Secor and A. Vail Frost will serve. William B. Buhlman and Richard B. Miller are the Unit leaders. Charter members of the Unit are John Hover, Lloyd Buchholtz, Thomas Byrne, Richard Davis, Jay Landgraf, John McGowan, John Occhipinti, Robert Secor and John Schmidheini.


