Allendale Police Warn Speeders

Single Out Two
Streets As Scenes
Of Violations

Safety Commissioner Carl Wehner, speaking at a meeting of the Allendale Chamber of Commerce last week, backed the warning to all motorists issued by Chief Marshal Kenneth Booth against speeding in the Borough, when he said emphatically that all motorists, whether Allendale residents or non-residents, "must observe our traffic laws." Violators will receive warning once, then summonses, he said, and no one need look to him to "kill tickets." He "backs up Allendale police force 100 per cent."

At the same time he condemned too promiscuous distribution of "tickets." Chief Booth, irked by the number of flagrant violators of the speed law on Cesrcent Avenue and the Franklin Turnpike, gave warning that the marshals had been given instructions to "stop" it by issuing summonses.

The hazards of pedestrian traffic is increased now that schools are closed for the summer months, and more so on the aforementioned streets which are rather arrow and have no sidewalks.
