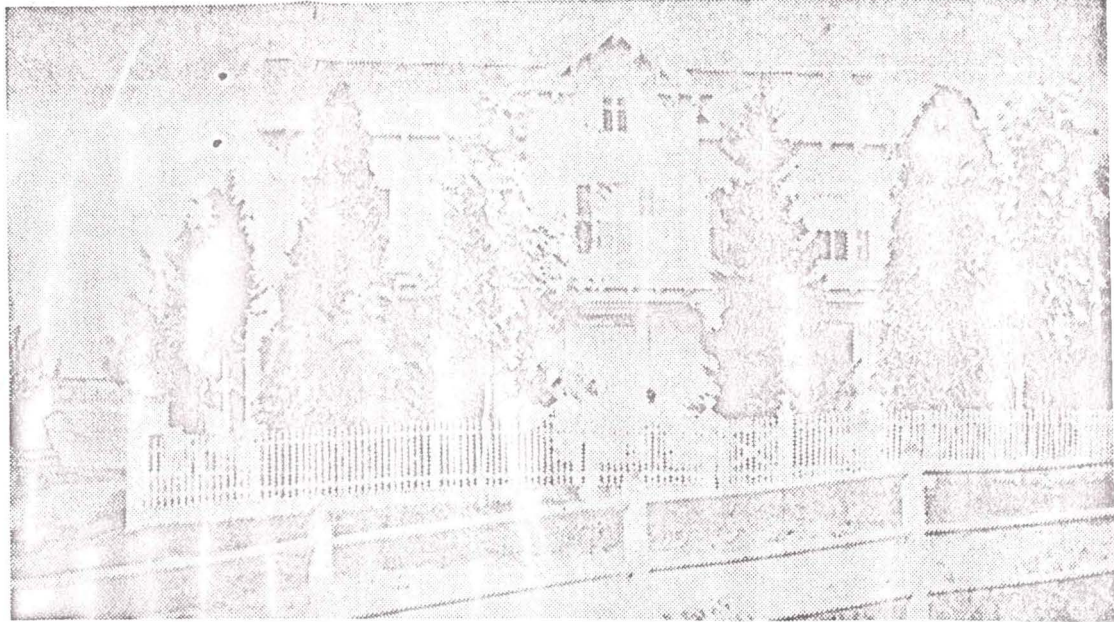

Old Zabriskie Home



THIS WAS THE OLD ZABRISKIE home on East Allendale Avenue, Allendale, as it appeared in 1889 when today's macadamized thoroughfare was just another dirt road, and today's majestic trees were spindling saplings. The fence in the foreground was a yellow fence on the Ashton property facing the 47-acre Zabriskie farm. The house itself, inherited by the late Albert Zabriskie's father in 1819 from an uncle of the same name and initials, dates from the end of the 18th Century. It was enlarged in the 1870s, made still larger in 1910 and destroyed by fire in 1910.

One of Allendale's Earliest Homes

THIS IS A PICTURE OF THE old Joseph Mallinson home in Allendale Avenue, Allendale, copied from a primitive tintype in the possession of the Allendale pioneer's grand-daughter, Mrs. J. M. Christopher. It stood some distance east of the present Mallinson house at 67 West Allendale Avenue, and now owned by Mr. and Mrs. William Hughes. John and Will Mallinson, the father of Mrs. Christopher, were born in this house. In the middle of the Nineteenth Century it was damaged by fire. The main portion of the house was moved to other property owned by Joseph Mallinson on the north side of the street. The smaller section, shown in the left of the picture, was moved to a spot behind the new house erected on the knoll, where it now stands, in the 1870s. Joseph Mallinson is shown at the right in this picture.

A New House From an Old Kitchen



THIS ATTRACTIVE SMALL home, framed by a new rose trellis and an old oak of majestic height and foliage, nestles behind the Mallinson home at 67 West Allendale Avenue, Allendale. It was the kitchen of the original Joseph Mallinson home which had been partially destroyed by fire in the mid-19th Century. It has been remodelled and enlarged by the new owners of the property, Mr. and Mrs. William Hughes, former Oklahomans.

No motor vehicle law violations were shown on the Allendale Police Blotter for July 28, 1889. There was no Police Blotter. No Motor Vehicle laws. No motor vehicles.

The sole traffic accident record, July 28, 1889, in Allendale was the report of a gay young blade's slight injury incurred in a fall from his horse and buggy after returning from a neighboring tavern, somewhat t-i-p-s-y.
