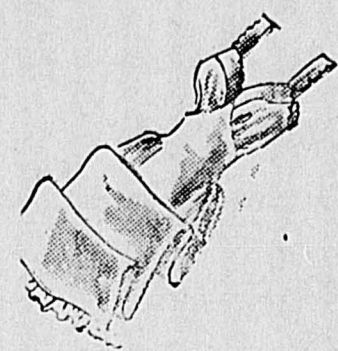
ALLENDALE BANK LOW BIDDER FOR SCHOOL BONDS

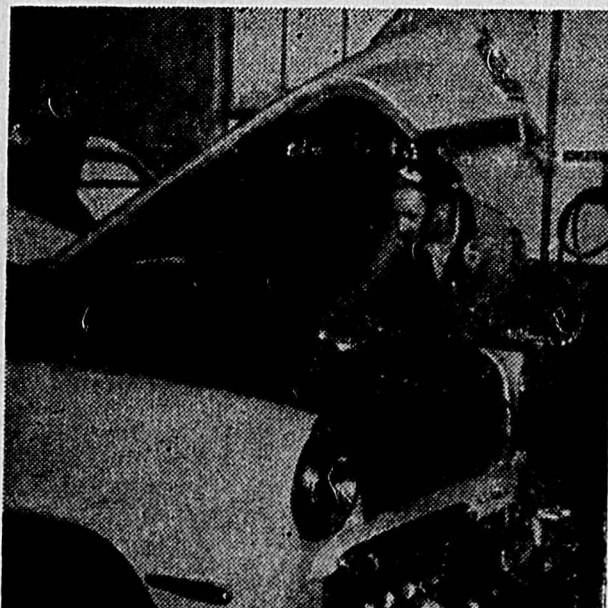

Our Civilian Defense Lagging

"Pearl Harbor has been attacked," those five words eleven years ago startled the Sunday listeners of any radio program. The death and destruction started on that fatal Sunday placed us on the road to a war that saw more Americans killed and maimed than ever before. A war that is still on, with only a brief respite that gave us enough time to "disarm the greatest fighting force ever created. We had put our men in the front lines all over the world. Pearl Harbor was a disaster, but as a means of uniting us as a nation, was the very thing needed to enable us to defeat the Japanese.

Today we are faced with another danger, this time from Russia. We are united but recent tests have shown us to be unprepared. The civilian refuses to give up anything for the war preparedness program. It is not entirely his fault as nothing has been done to lead the nation into being prepared. We have a change in the federal government and with the change we hope a program will be drawn to show us the way.

Here in Allendale we have been lax too. There is much that could be done. We need more air raid wardens, we need a blood typing program, we need more daytime fire-fighters, mobile utility workers are required and communications between Allendale and other communities must be set up. You will note we didn't mention the police and for that we can thank Frank Parenti and his men who have continued to study and be prepared. They have done this with little or no help from the local civilian defense or council.

We respectfully suggest to the incoming Mayor that he check into the local civilian defense program at once. We must have the framework for instant action and if it is not there he must revise the local program so it is. Some money must be spent but let's spend it after we decide what we need. The next attack on our shores will not be a Pearl Harbor. It will be all over the country and not thousands of miles away but right here, New York, Washington, Detroit, Pittsburgh and every other center of war production. Russian workers are all around us and they will not hesitate for one minute in their mission of destruction. We must be prepared and immediately.
