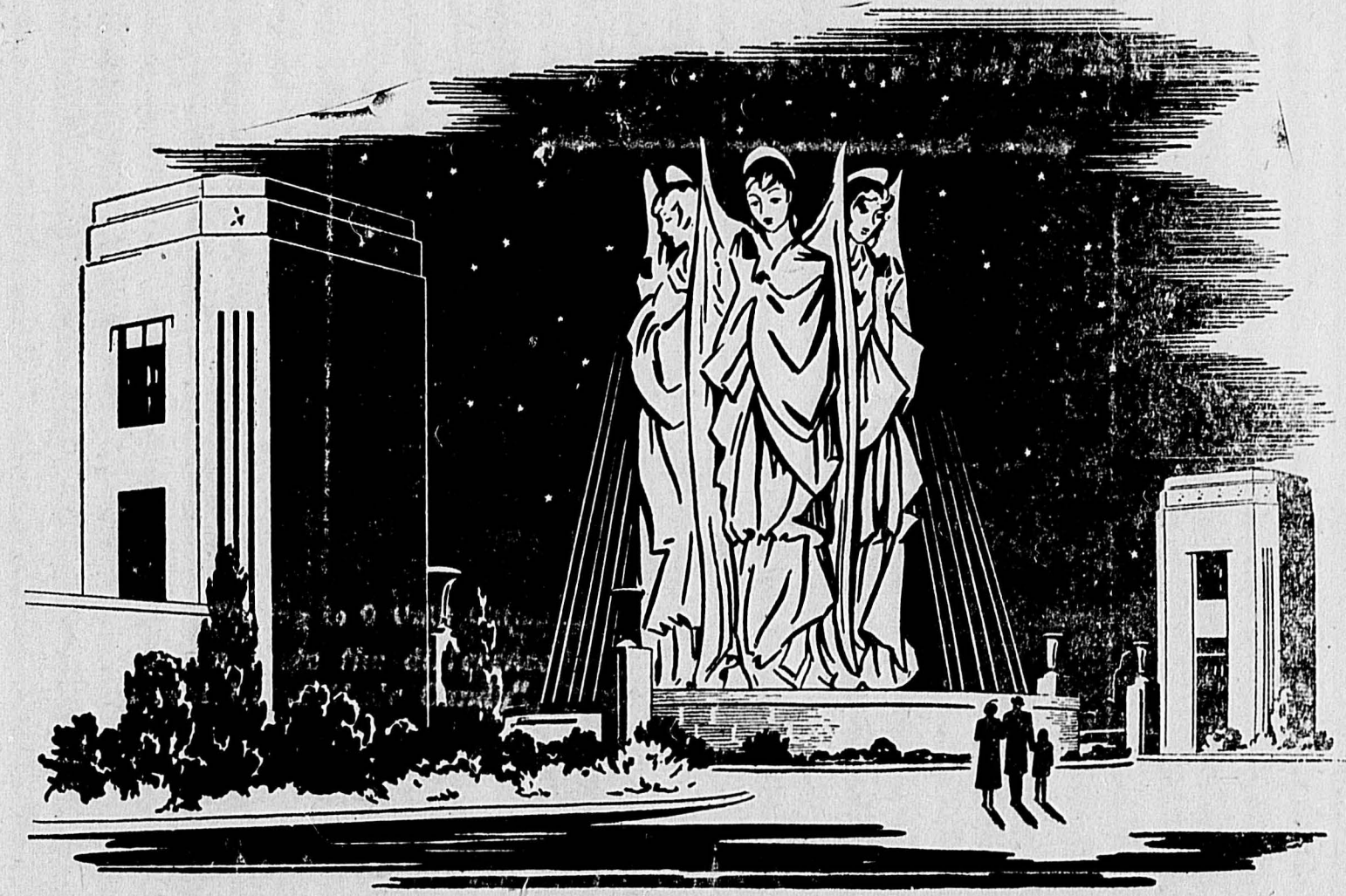

At the start of the meeting a resolution of the board, introduced by Fred Rickerich, Jr. took Mr. Wilson to task for his criticisms of the board at the last Council meeting. Later Mr. Wilson ruefully stated he had "taken quite a pasting from the board." Little doubt that this will not be the last of this matter was left as an impression.

Borough attorney John Chri-

stie, who attended the meeting and advised the board, was directed to start action against the Donald Engineering Co. and Mr. Joseph Mahoney of Cottage Place and Franklin Turnpike for alleged violations of the sub division act. It concerns the buying of a small strip of land adjoining property owned by Mr. Santree. Mr. Mahoney uses the land for parking a small truck of his employer, N. J. Bell Telephone Company.

Another violator of the sub division act, Mr. A. Weinert of New York escaped being fined for the offense when the statute of limitations of two years had expired. The property in question now owned by Mr. Edgar Becker was approved for subdivision pending the installation of water mains. Mr. Becker stated he intended to put in pipes on the Brookside Avenue property as soon as he secured permission from the water department.

Approval of a tentative budget to be presented by the council was drawn up as follows: \$8,000 for the completion of the west side station parking plaza; \$1,000 for the improving of the intersection of Crescent and Myrtle Ave. Operating expenses of \$1,400 with an anticipated income of \$200 from fees being received.

This was the last meeting of Mayor Johnson, and L. R. McPeck. A vote of thanks was given both for their work on the board and a request that Mr. McPeck be reappointed to the board will be made. Coun-
