as the first principal of Wallington High School, after which he accepted the principalship at Mountain Lakes. Mr. Hopkins is 42, married and the father of two daughters. Last Thursday, he was elected president of the New Jersey Secondary School Principals Association.

The board appointed Perkins and Will of White Plains, N.Y., as architects. Members of the architects committee visited some of the firm's recently constructed schools, as well as a number of schools designed by other architects.

The board accepted the resignation of Paul B. Miller, finance chairman and chairman of the site selection committee, with regret. Mr. Miller has been transferred to Texas. He served as an active member on the regional board since its inception.

A replacement from Upper Saddle River will be made within 65 days, upon approval of the entire board. Interested citizens from Upper Saddle River will be considered by the board for this vacancy.
