

Osborne Boosts List of Candidates To Four in Allendale Primary Fight

ALLENDALE -- Councilman Robert J. Osborne announced this week that he would seek reelection and would enter the Republican primary contest which will choose two council candidates from a list of four contestants.

Mr. Osborne announced that he had been approached by many people who asked him to reconsider his decision not to seek reelection. He added that a personal problem which had made it difficult for him to be sure of finishing a full term in office had been satisfactorily resolved.

Mr. Osborne, a lifetime resident of the borough has served one term on the council. Before his election he served as chief of the Fire Department, of which he has been a member for 24 years. He was active in the Boy Scouts during the period of his

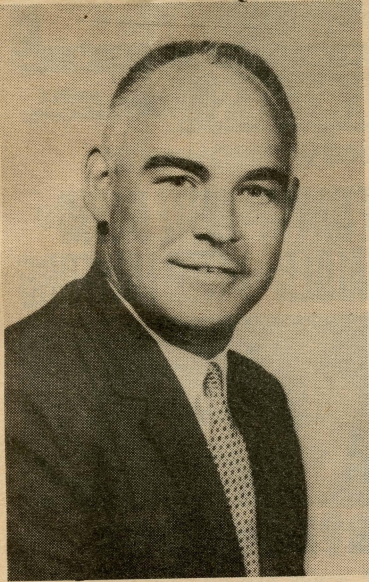
