
JUNIOR COLLECT

GENERAL FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS - JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP DEPT. PROJECTS

<u>NARC</u> (National Association for Retarded Children) was organized in 1950 to assist retarded persons everywhere to achieve the same rights and opportunities accorded all members of human society. It is a voluntary organization devoted solely to promoting the welfare of our retarded citizens and their families. For two years the GFWC Juniors have lent support in the areas of (1) Recruitment Program - Careers in Mental Retardation; (2) Day Care services for mentally retarded; (3) Public Education on Research. Specific areas where Juniors might significantly assist are: (1) fund-raising; (2) Service projects in conjunction with a local Association; and (3) Public relations and education.

Project Concern is an independent, non-profit organization providing medical care and medical, educational and supplementary self-help programs in Hong Kong, South Vietnam, Mexico and the U.S.A. During the past two years, GFWC Juniors assisted Project Concern by (1) Goods-inkind; (2) Public awareness; (3) fund-raising. Three areas of participation are in need of Junior support within the next two years: (A) the domestic program, which will serve the Appalachian region in Tennesee and Kentucky, and the Navajo and Hopi Indians in New Mexico; (B) A Fediatric-Maternity Hospital currently under construction at Cosa de Todos, Mexico--the only one of its kind in this area; (C) The Living Memorial Hospital located at Lun Hein, South Vietnam--a 40-bed hospital dedicated on February 3, 1970 in memory of the U.S. men who have given their lives in Vietnam. - 25 -

> BY-LAWS Revised: June 1970

Article I Name

The name of the Club shall be the Junior Woman's Club of Allendale, New Jersey, Inc.

Article II Object

The objects of this organization shall be to (a) render service to the community as a group; (b) bring together young women interested in subjects of general and social importance that they may be helpful to one another; (c) cooperate loyally with the Woman's Club of Allendale and the State Junior Membership Department. <u>Article III Membership</u> Section 1

The Club chall come

The Club shall consist of Active, Associate and Honorary members.

- 56 -

Section 2

A. This Club may admit to membership residents of any city in this "district" as that term is described by the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs.

<u>B.</u> The age limit for Juniors shall be from 18 to 35. If a Junior reaches the age of 35 on or before April 30th, she is no longer a Junior and shall be expected to join the Woman's Club the following club year.

<u>C.</u> A letter of transfer from another Federated Club may be accepted in lieu of any endorsement.

<u>D.</u> A candidate for membership shall make application upon a form provided by the Club and her name shall be proposed to the Executive Board and endorsed by one or more members in good standing.

<u>E.</u> To complete membership requirements, the prospective member must attend 2 regular meetings, 1 department meeting, and participate on one service project. Detailed additional suggested requirements — ? are in the Club Policies.

<u>F.</u> When this has been accomplished, the Executive Board will approve the applicant for membership and notify her in writing. Having been notified of her election and having paid her initiation fee and dues, according to Article III, Section 3, the applicant shall be a member in good standing.

G. At this time the new member shall receive a copy of the Club Yearbook, By-Laws and Club Policies. <u>Installation</u> - Installation of new members may be held twice a year at the December or Nay regular meeting or whenever deemed necessary. The candlelight service or other appropriate installation ceremony shall be conducted by the Membership Chairman or the Club President. <u>Section 3</u>

<u>A.</u> The annual dues shall be payable by May 1 but no later than June 30. Active and Associate members shall pay annual dues of \$10.00 (ten) plus \$2.00 (two) assessment from which shall be paid State, General Federation and District dues.

B. There shall be an initiation fee of \$2.00 (two) for each new member of this club which shall be payable upon application for membership.
C. New members must pay the required dues upon acceptance into the miswas club. Members accepted after November 30 will pay \$6.00 (six) for charged. the balance of the fiscal year ending April 30.
D. A dues statement shall be sent by the Treasurer April 1, Final notice shall be sent June 1. If the dues are not paid in full by charge? June 30, unless specific arrangements have been made with the Treasurer and the President, membership shall automatically terminate.
Section 4 - Active, Associate and Honorary Members
A. An active member may hold office and take part in the proceedings

A. An active member may hold office and take part in the proceedings of the club. She shall attend one Federation activity a year and may not miss more than 3 consecutive meetings a year. Failure to fulfill these obligations may result in her being made an inactive member at the discretion of the board. She shall pay initiation fees and dues as provided herein. - 58 -

Responsibilities - most panticipate in projects requiring total membership panticipation.

B. An Associate member shall be a member who is unable to regularly attend Club meetings. She shall have no vote and may not hold office. She must have been an active member for one year before she is eligible, upon written application to the Executive Board, for a change in membership status, for not longer than two years. She shall pay initiation fees and dues as provided herein.

<u>C.</u> An inactive member shall be a person who has not complied with the requirements for an active member. She shall have no vote and may not hold office. By the end of the club year an inactive member must re-apply for active status or her membership shall be terminated. <u>D.</u> An Honorary member may be anyone whom the Executive Board, in its sole discretion, finds deserving of this honor. She may visit meetings, voice her opinions in discussions, but have no vote. <u>Section 5 - Resignations</u>

<u>A.</u> Any member desiring to resign from the Club may do so by sending a written resignation to the Corresponding Secretary and fulfilling her financial obligations.

B. Any member who has resigned in good standing may, having applied in writing to the Corresponding Secretary, be re-instated by a vote of the Executive Board.

<u>C.</u> The Executive Board shall have power to call to account a member who violates one or more By-Laws or whose activities are contrary to Federation Policy or to take such action thereafter as the Executive Board shall approve by a 2/3 vote of its members present.

Article IV Officers Section 1

The officers of this Club shall be a President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, all of whom shall be elected by ballot at the regular business meeting in April.

The Federation Secretary shall be the immediate out-going President. If she is unavailable, the President shall appoint another member deemed most qualified to fill the position. Section 2 Nomination Procedures

A. The committee of Nomination shall consist of five members. The Chairman shall be appointed by the President and four members shall be elected at the regular February business meeting.

<u>B.</u> As a matter of courtesy, the committee of nomination shall consider the name of any then incumbent officer who is eligible for reelection and expresses a willingness to serve an additional year in the same office.

<u>C.</u> The committee of Nomination shall then communicate with each member of the Club on or before the Farch business meeting, asking if she wishes to run for an office or suggest a candidate for an office. All candidates must express to the committee their willingness to serve. A complete list of candidates shall be read at the March meeting. D. At the March and April business meetings, nominations from the floor will be in order for each office and voting shall take place at the APRIL meeting.

E. Formal installation of new officers shall take place in MAY. The installation ceremony may be conducted by the Club Advisor or the District Advisor JMD.

Section 3 Election Procedure

Election of officers shall be at the regular meeting in April. The election shall be by secret ballot and a plurality of not less than five votes shall elect.

Section 4 Terms

Officers shall serve for a full term of one year and may be eligible for re-election to the same office. No member of less than one year's standing is eligible for the office of President. No member may serve more than two years in the same office with the exception of the Treasurer.

Section 5 Vacancies in Office

A. In the event of the resignation or inability of the President to serve in that capacity for any reason whatsoever, the First Vice President shall automatically assume the Presidency and the Second Vice President shall assume the First Vice Presidency. A Second Vice President shall then be appointed by the President. B. In the event of the resignation of an officer other than the

President, an election with nominations from the floor shall be held at the business meeting next following her resignation and the

member so elected shall immediately assume office.

<u>C.</u> Officers so appointed or elected who fill an unexpired term of less than six months shall be eligible for re-election for two full consecutive terms for the same or another office.

<u>D.</u> If any member shall resign during her term of office, one year should elapse before she is eligible for re-election to that office. <u>Section 6 Duties of Officers</u>

<u>A.</u> The President shall preside at all meetings and shall perform the regular duties of the office. She shall appoint all Department and Special Committee Chairmen and shall be ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee. She has the power to call special meetings of the Executive Board or the membership. <u>B.</u> The First Vice President shall preside in the absence of the Fresident and shall fulfill all the duties of the office. The First Vice President shall, with an appointed committee of two and the Second Vice President, prepare the programs for each Club meeting from September to June inclusive. It shall be her responsibility, together with a committee of at least three, to prepare and have ready for the Junior Lembership Department and the Club membership by September 1, the Club Yearbook.

<u>C.</u> The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and the First Vice President and shall fulfill all the duties of the office. The Second Vice President shall be the Chairman of the budget and the Finance Committee. She shall, with an appointed committee of at least two, and the First Vice Fresident,

membership for consideration proposed changes, if any. They shall be dealt with as prescribed in the By-Laws.

<u>D.</u> The Recording Secretary shall record the minutes of all business and Executive Board meetings which shall be an accurate record of the business transacted. She shall make available the minutes of the current Club year at all regular and Executive Board meetings. She shall keep a record of the roll of the Club's members. In the absence of the President and both Vice Presidents, the Recording Secretary shall call the meeting to order and preside until a Chairman pro-tem shall be elected. Included in her records she shall also keep a list of current Club policies.

E. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence required by the President and the Executive Board. She shall keep a current record of all Club correspondence.

<u>F.</u> The Treasurer shall receive all monies belonging to the Club and pay all bills approved by the Board. She shall keep a record of all receipts and disbursements and render a complete record at the April meeting. All bills shall be paid by check and countersigned by the President.

<u>G.</u> The Federation Secretary shall keep the Club advised of all Federation activities, be familiar with its projects, and fulfill the duties of the office as outlined by the Federation.

Article V Meetings

Section 1

<u>A.</u> There shall be one monthly regular business meeting of the Club from September to May inclusive followed by a program, except when otherwise ordered by the Club or the Executive Board. There shall be a banquet in May for the formal installation of Officers. There shall be a re-organizational meeting in June.

B. There shall be one regular monthly meeting of the Executive Board,

<u>Section 2</u> - The Annual Meeting shall be held in APRIL. Officers shall be elected for the ensuing year and reports of the officers and the department chairmen will be given.

Section 3 - There shall be special meetings held at the call of the President.

<u>Section 4</u> - Two thirds of the active members of the Club, as listed on the records of the membership department, shall constitute a quorum for the purposes of these By-Laws.

Article VI Board of Directors

Section 1 - The Executive Board shall consist of the officers, Department Chairmen, Junior Representative to the Woman's Club, Sub-Junior Advisor and the Woman's Club Advisor. Section 2

<u>A.</u> The Executive Board shall act in an advisory capacity in transacting the club business. The Board shall approve all bills above the budgeted amount, solicitations, and contributions of funds. <u>B.</u> The Board shall approve all applications for membership into the Club and be empowered to act in an emergency on behalf of the Club. <u>C.</u> The Board shall change, if necessary, the date of the regular and executive board meetings.

<u>D.</u> The quorum of the Executive Board is a majority plus one. <u>Section 3</u> - The Woman's Club shall provide two advisors in accordance with their By-Laws, one of whom should be a member of their Executive Board.

<u>Section 4</u> - The President shall appoint a member to serve as the Junior representative to the Woman's Club Executive Board. She shall attend their executive board meetings and, when possible, their regular club meetings and report to the Junior Membership. Article VII Committees

<u>Section 1</u> - The activities of the Junior Woman's Club of Allendale shall be conducted by the Department and Special Committee Chairmen appointed by the President. In the event Co-Chairmen are appointed, they shall act in a single capacity having only one voice and one vote.

<u>Section 2</u> - Department and standing committees may be as listed by the Junior Membership Department in the Federation Yearbook and "Eureka!". The Department Chairman shall be responsible for at least one project a year.

<u>Section 3</u> - The President shall appoint an auditing committee in September which committee shall examine the books of the treasurer before the April meeting. The committee shall sign and report the books when audited. No officer or member of the Executive Board shall serve on the Auditing Committee.

Section 4 - The Membership Chairman shall keep a complete record of the membership of the Club and actively engage in the solicitation of new members.

Article VIII Delegates to Annual Convention

The out-going and in-coming Presidents shall be the Club's two delegates to the Annual State Convention. In the case of the reelection of the President, the in-coming First Vice President shall be the delegate. The Club shall provide a President's Fund of \$30.00 (thirty) each to be used for Convention expenses for the delegates. Article IX Sub-Junior Department

Section 1

There may be a Sub-Junior Department known as the "Sub-Junior

Section of the Junior Woman's Club of Allendale, New Jersey, Inc., organized under the provisions of the State Federation and operating under the Junior Standing Rules set down by the Federation. <u>Section 2</u> - There shall be one advisor from the Junior Woman's Club appointed by the Club President and she shall be a member of the Executive Board. She shall attend all Sub-Junior functions including their executive board and regular meetings. She shall be a liason between the Juniors and the Sub-Junior Section. Article IX

Section 1 - These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a 2/3 vote, a quorum being present, provided the proposed amendment has been read by the secretary at the previous regular meeting or shall have been sent by mail to each member at least five days before such a vote.

<u>Section 2</u> - Amendments may also be made without previous notice at any regular meeting by unanimous vote, a quorum being present.

Article XI Restrictions

Section 1 - No obligation shall be contracted without the authority of the Board, nor shall any debt or obligation be approved by the Board beyound the available means within their control to pay or discharge same.

<u>Section 2</u> - No public action shall be taken and no communication in regard to a public matter shall be made, by or in the name of the Club, unless the same shall have been ordered by a vote of the quorum of ALL Club members.

Article XII Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in <u>Robert's Rules of Order Revised</u> shall govern the Club in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

Article XIII Incorporation

Section 1

This Club shall be incorporated as a non-profit organization with the State of New Jersey. This Club shall file the proper forms and annual reports.

Section 2

There shall be five trustees, as required by the State, listed in this order: President; Second Vice President; Treasurer; First Vice President; and Recording Secretary.
