All Jersey Juniors will work. for and support this organization through aid to our State Kidney groups such as the Ruth Gottscho Kidney Foundation. Most of this work will be public education and fund raising. (These plans are tenative depending on Eureka outline.)

## Article I - Name

The name of the Club shall be the Junior Woman's Club of Allendale, New Jersey, Inc.
Article II - Object
The objects of this organization shall be to (a) render service to the community as a group; (b) bring together young women interested in subjects of general and social importance that they may be helpful to one another; (c) cooperate loyally with the Woman's Club of Allendale and State Junior Membership Department.
Article III - Membership , delete categoty
The Club shall consist of Active, Assoeiate, Inactive and Honorary members. Section 2
A. This Club may admit to membership residents of any city in this district as that term is described by the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs. B. The age limit for Juniors shall be from 18 to 35. If a Junior reaches the age of 35 on or before April 30th, she is no longer a Junior and shall be ex-encouraged pected to join the Woman's Club the following club year.
C. A letter of transfer from another Federated Club may be accepted in lieu of any endorsement.
D. A candidate for membership shall make application upon a form provided by the Club and her name shall be proposed to the Executive Board and endorsed by one or more members in good standing.
E. To complete membership requirements, the prospective member must attend 2 regular meetings, 1 department meeting, and participate on one service project.
E. When this has been accomplished, the Executive Board will approve the applicant for membership and notify her in writing: Having been notified of her election and having paid her initiation fee, dues and assessment fee, according to Article III, Section 3, the applicant shall be a member in good Notat standing. Install $-\frac{* G}{} G$. At this time the new member shall receive a copy of the Club Yearbook, By--Laws and Club Policies.
H. Installation of new members may be held twice a year at the December or May regular meeting or whenever deemed necessary. The candlelight service or other appropriate installation ceremony shall be conducted by the Membership Chairman or the Club President.
Section 3

A. The annual dues shall be payable by April 1 but no later than May 15. Active and Associate members shall pay annual dues of $\$ 10.00$ (ten) plus $\$ 2.00$ (two) assessment from which shall be paid State, General. Federation, and District dues, Members whogenues have not been paid by Mavehis will be dropped from B. There shall be an initiation fee of $\$ 2.00$ (two) for each new member of this.
club which shall be payable upon application for membership.
C. New members must pay the required dues uponaacceptance into the club. Members zeoepted-after the regular December meeting will pay $\$ 6.00$ (six) for the balance--of the -fiscal year -ending March 31.
D. A dues statement shall be sent by the Treasurer shell be sent Mayl. If the dues are not paid in full by May 15, unless specific arrangements have been made with the Treasurer and the President, membership shall automatically terminate.
Section 4 - Active, Associate and Honorary Members
A. An active member may hold office and take part in the proceedings of the club. must She shall atytund one Federation activity a year and may not miss more than 3 consecutive meetings a year. Failure to fulfill these obligations may result in her being made an inactive member at the discretion of the board. She shall pay initiation fees and dues as provided herein.
B. An Associate member shall be a member who is unable to regularly attend Club meetings. She shall have no vote and may not hold office. She must have been an active member for one year before she is eligible, upon written application to the Executive Board, for a change in membership status, for not longer than two years. She shall pay initiation fees and dues as provided herein. C. An inactive member shall be a person who has not complied with the requirements for an active member. She shall have no vote and may not hold office. By the end of the club year an inactive member must re-apply for active status or her membership shall be terminated.
D. An Honorary member may be anyone whom the Executive Board, in its sole discretion, finds deserving of this honor. She may visit meetings, voice her opinions in discussions, but have no vote, ${ }^{7}$ pay no dues Section 5-Resignations
A. Any member desiring to resign from the Club may do so by sending a written resignstion to the Corresponding Secretary and fulfiliing her financial obligations. E. Any member who has resigned in good standing may, having applied in writing
to the Corresponding Secretary, be re-instated by a vote of the Executive Board. C. The Executive Board shall have power to call to account a member who violates one or more d By-Laws 101 whose activities are contrary to Federation Policy or to take such action thereafter as the Executive Board shall approve by a $2 / 3$ vote of its members present. Article IV - Officers
Section 1
The officers of this Club shall be a President, lst Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, all of whom shall be elected by ballot at the regular business meeting in April.

The Federation Secretary shall be the immediate out-going President. If she is unavailable, the President shall appoint another member deemed most qualified to fill the position. Section 2 - Nomination Procedures
A. The committee of Nomination shall consist of five members. The Chairman shall be appointed by the President and four members shall be elected at the regular February business meeting.
B. As a matter of courtesy, the committee of nomination shall consider the name of any then incumbent officer who is eligible for re-election and expresses a willingness to serve an additional year in the same office. C. The committee of Nomination shall then communicate with each member of the Club on or before the liarch business meeting, asking if she wishes to run for an office or suggest a candidate for an office. All candidates must express to the committee their willingness to serve. A complete list of candidates shall be read at the March meeting.
D. The ITominating Committee shall prepare a "double slate" wherever and whenever possible.
E. If a vacancy occurs on the slate between nominations and elections, nominations shall be made fron the floor to fill this post at the next business meeting.
F. At the arch and April business meetings, nominations from the floor will be in order for each office and voting shall take place at the APRIL meeting. G. Formal installation of new officers shall talke place in hay. The installation ceremony may be conducted by the Club Advisor or the District Advisor JMD. Sbetion ? - Election Procedure

Election of officers shall be at the regular meeting in April. The election shall be by secret ballot and a majority shall elect. Section 4-Terns

Officers shall serve for a full term of one year and may be eligible for re-election to the same office. No momber of less than one year's standing is eligible for the office of President. No member may serve more than two years in the same office with the exception of the Treasurer.
Section 5-Vacancies in 0pfice
A. In the event of the resignation or inability of the President to serve in that capacity for any reason whatsoever, the First Vice President shall automatically assume the Presidency and the Second Vice President shall assume the Firsi Vice Presidency. A Second Vice President shall then be nominated and elected by the general membership.
E. In the event of the resignation of an officer other than the President, an election with nominations fron the floor shall be held at the business
meeting next following her resignation and the member so elected shall immediately assume office.
C. Officers so appointed or elected who fill an unexpired term of less than six months shall be eligible for re-election for two full consecutive terms for the same or another office.
D. If any member shall resign during her term of office, one year should elapse before she is eligible for re-election to that office. Section 6 - Duties of Officers
A. The President shall preside at all meetings and shall perform the regular duties of the office. She shall appoint all Department and Special Committee Chairmen and shall be ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee. She has the power to call special meetings of the Executive Board or the membership.
B. The First Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and shall fulfill all the duties of the office. The First Vice President shall, with an appointed committee of two and the Second Vice President, prepare the programs for each Club meeting from September to June inclusive. It shall be her responsibility, together with a committee of at least three, to prepare and have ready for the Junior Membership Department and the Club membership by September 1, the Club Yearbook.
C. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and the First Vice President and shall fulfill all the duties of the office. The Second Vice President shall be the Chairman of the Budget and Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee. She shall, with an appointed committee of at least two, and the First Vice President, review
each year the By-Laws of this organization and bring to its membership for consideration proposed changes, if any. They shall be dealt with as prescribed in the By-L, aws.
D. The Recouding Secretary shan record the minutes of all business and Executive Board meetings" which shatl be an accurate record of the business transacted. She shall make available the minutes of the current Club year at all regular and Executive Board meetings. She shall keep a record of the roll of the Club's members. In the absence of the President and both Vice Presidents, the Recording Secretary shall call the meeting to order and preside until a Chaiman Pro-tem shall be elected. Iricluded in her records she shall also keep a list of current Club policies.
E. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence required by the President and the Executive Board. She shall keep a current record of all Club correspondence.
F. The Treasurer shall receive all monies belonging to the Club and pay all bills epproved by the Board. She shall keep a record of all receipts and disbursements and render a complete record at the APRIL meeting. All bills shall be paid by cheos.
AT. The Federation Secretary shall keep the Club advised of all Federation activities, be familiar with its projects, and fulfill the duties of the office as outlined by the Federation.

Article VII - Committees
Section 1

Section 2

$\therefore$ There may be a Sub-Junior Department known as the "Sub-uJunior Section of the Junior Womanis Club of Allendale, New Jersey, Inc.", organized under the provisions of the State Federation and operating under the Junior Standing Rules set down by the Federation. Section 2

There shall be one advisor from the Junior Woman's Club appointed by the Club President and she shall be a member of the Executive Board. She shall attend all Snb-Junior functions including their executive board and regular meetings. She shall be a liason between the Juniors and the Sub-Junior Section.

## Article $X$ - By-Laws

## Section 1

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a $2 / 3$ vote, 2 quorum being present, provided the proposed amendment has been read by the Secretary at the previous regular meeting or shall have been sent by mail to each member at least five days before such a vote. Section 2

Amendments may also be made without previous notice at any regular meeting by unanimous vote, a quorum being present. Article XI - Restrictions Section 1

No obligation shall be contracted without the authority of the Board, nor shall any debt or obligation be approved by the Board beyond the available means within their control to pay or discharge same. Section 2

No public action shall be taken and no communication in regard to a public matter shall be made, by or in the name of the Club, unless the same shall have been ordered by a vote of the quorum of ALL CLUB members. ARTICLE XII - Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Onder Newly Revised shall govern the Club in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

## Article XIII - Incorporation

## Section 1

This Club shall be incorporated as a non-profit organization with the State of New Jersey. This Club shall file the proper forms and annual reports. Section 2

There shall be five trustees, as required by the State, listed in this order: President; Second Vice President; Treasurer; First Vice President; and Recording Secretary.


## Financial

1. The Club shall carry a comprehensive liability insurance policy. The policy currently carried is renewable every year and is paid every three years.
$\$ 50$ per year is budgeted toward payment of this policy.
2. The Club shall maintain one bank account which shall be a checking account.
3. All funds raised through Consumer Research will be placed in the "Department

Fund."
a. Each department will be allotted $\$ 5.00$ operating expenses at the beginning of the Club year.
b. Departments wishing use of funds over and above the initial $\$ 5$ allotted must apply to the Board for further funds.
c. All monjes remaining in the Department Fund at the end of the Club year. (vith the exception of a specified amount to be set aside for operating expenses for the following years' Department to begin with) will automatically be placed in the general Club treasury to be allocated as donations to charities,
?. (d. All Club members are expected to participate In. Consumer Research to the)
4. All proceeds from Club Ways and Means functions will be placed in the general Club treasury unless the Club has voted to allocate all or part of the proceeds from a particular function to a specific charity, fund, etc.
5. All funds raised through the rental of the Club coffee pot, flatware, etc. will be credited to the Hospitality Fund. This money shall be reserved and
used for repair and maintenance of Club-owned hospitality items, and for the purchase of additional "permanent" items needed for Club Hospitality.
6. All inftiation fees paid by new members will be credited to the Membership Department.
7. No individual department shall conduct a fund raiser per se for the benefit of its department treasury without explicit approval of the Board. (Department projects such as Glass Recycling Drives, which may return a profit, but that are primarily conducted as a service, are not included in this category.)
8. The Treasurer shall, at all times, be happy to receive suggestions from the general membershíp regarding possible recipients of donations. No funds shall be donated, however, without the approval of the Board and/or general membership.
PROTOCOL

1. The following people are invited to the Annual Installation Banquet, and the Club pays for their dinners: State Chairman J.M.D. (if local); Northern Vice Chairman J.M.D. (if local); 1lth District Advisor; our own incoming Advisor from the Woman's Club; incoming President of the Woman's Club; incoming President of the Woman's Evening Club and Selma liaskery. The following people may be invited to the Annval Installation Banquet, but must pay for their own dinners: past presidents, pasti advisors, honorary members and honorary advisors, and guests of current members.
2. When seating guests at a head table, the guest of honor is placed to the right of presiding officer, second ranking guest to the left of the presiding officer third ranking guest to the right of the guest of honor, fourth ranking guest to the second left, etc. Guests are introduced in reverse order according to rank, concluding with the guest of honor.
3. Members rise to honor the office of State Chairman, N.J.S.F.W.C.-J.H.D.; State President, I. J.S.F.V.C. and President of the General Federation.

She should prepare a written report and financial statement (in triplicate) within a week of the function, and she should submit copies of the report to the President, the Second Vice President and the Treasurer of the Club. 3. The Hospitality Chairman shall be in charge of all the Club flatware, dishes, coffee pot, etc, as well as paper products, and shall supervise the use and rental of such. She shall assign hostesses for all regular meetings and Board meetings throughout the year, and shall notify hostesses prior to their assigned service. She shall explain to each temporary hostess her duties for the month.
3. The Scrapbook Chairman shall be responsible for care and use of the Club camera. She shall purchase film, flashcubes, and any other accessories needed for the "Photographs" in the Club's budget. mettry, actively
TMEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES
4. Each member is expected to join, at least one working department (of her choice).
5. New members must join one or more departments upon acceptance into the Club.
6. Any Club member may change Department affiliation at any time, provided she
 Department Chairman) as well as the Membership Chairman of her intent.
7. Each member of the Club is automatically a working member of the Hembership Depariment and of the Community Improvement Program Department, and as such, is responsible for recruiting new members and assisting with the Community Improvement projects.
8. During years when the Junior Membership Department carries a State Project, (every other year) each Club member is automatically responsible for assisting and/or supporting the Club's eflorts on behalf of State Project.
9. Each member is expected to follow on the rules of comon courtesy, such as adyising the Chaiman if she is unable to attend a Department, Board or Comittee fieeting, or if she is unable to fulfill an obligation she has comiñitued herself to.
10. Each member ذis expected to serve as a regular meeting hostess or co-hostess for one meeting of each Club year. The May hostesess is zutomatically the Chairman of the Installation Banquet, Each Board member; is expected to serve as a Board meeting hostess or co-hostess for one Board meeting of each Club year.
11. Every Club nember is required to participate in "Total Hembership" Club projects (which are voted on by the entire Club) unless excused from participation by the Board.
12. Expectant mothers are not expected to participate in Club activities six weeks prior to expected date of delivery and six.weeks following actual delivery date. AWARDS
13. The Clubwoman of the Year Award shall be presented to the outstanding Allendale Junior by Miss Selma liaskery at the Club's Annual Installation Banquet. The Clubwoman of the Year is selected in a secret vote of the entire membership at the April meeting. The unopened ballots are sealed in an envelope and mailed
to Miss liaskery, who has the silver bowl inscribed with the name of the winner and presents it to her at the Installation Banquet.
14. The "Newcomer of the Year Award" shall be presented by the Membership Chairman at the Club's Annual Installation Banquet. If there are two "classes" of installed new members (usually May and December) there will be one award given for each "class". The entire membership votes by secret ballot at the April Club meeting for the recipient(s) of this award and the ballots are tabulated by Membership Chairman. The results are kept secret until the award is presented at the Installation Banquet.
15. The liaster of Service Award may be presented to any member of the Club who has an outstanding record of service and loyalty to the Club. This award may only be given with the approval of the Board.
16. Honorary liembership may be awarded to any member or friend of the Club who has an outstanding record of service and loyalty to the Junior Woman's Club of Allendale. The award may be given only with the approval of the Board.
MISCELLANEOUS
17. There shall be a joint meeting of the Woman's Club and the Junior Woman's Club at least once during each Club year, with each Club alternating as hostess for one meeting.
18. The Club shall participate every year in the Memorial Day Service. Ninimally, the Club President shall be present at the Services conducted at liemorial Park to place a symbolic flower in an urn. In the past our Club has also marched or driven a car in the parade.
19. The Club shall designate a member to serve as its representative to the Northern Highlands Regional High School Scholarship Fund Committee.
20. The following Club members shall have a vote at Executive Board meetings:
a. Elected and appointed Club Officers, including the Fecieration Secretary
b. Department Chaimmen
c. Juni ór Representative to Woman's Club
d. Sub-turior Adrisor (iti any)
e. Our Advisor(s)from the oman's Club

## Restrictions:

a. Chamen of Heys and Means projects do not have separate votes: however, thay may corticx with the Second VicewPresident, who as Wevg and lieans Chairmen, mus'u east the vote.
b. One nember, sexving in multiple capacities each of which entitle her to a vote, may oniy cast ore vote, regardiess of her multiple aevivity.

2. Honorary members shall automatically be sent complimentary subscriptions to the Club newspaper (The Announcer).
3. Former Club members and graduates shall be offered the opportunity to subscribe to the Club newspaper (The Announcer) at a fee of $\$ 2.00$. per year,
4. A joint committee composed of representatives from the three Federated Clubs in Allendale and the two Federated Clubs in Upper Saddle River (because ours is a regional high school, serving both communities) work with the H.S. Guidance Department in selecting delegates for Citizenship Institute, publicizing the program and arranging a joint tea with the delegate and their mothers prior to the June week of Citizenship Institute. The purpose of the tea is to familiarize delegates and their mothers with the program and the activities scheduled, and to facilitate the making of reciprocal arrangements for transportation.
5. The Junior Woman's Club of Allendale maintains Charge accounts at two stores, which allow us a discount at The Ridgewood Typewriter Shop (Ridgewood) Mermi-Mart Gift Shop (AIlencle). Nembers shopping for Club supplies are encouraged to use these charge account (please inform the Treasurer if you do) and to take advantage of the discount offered.
