
In an article written by Marsha Stoltz for the <u>Town Journal</u>, February 27, 1986, the house was described:

...just south of the proposed townhouse entrance is another tri-gabled ell house at 45 Maple Street. This circa-1876 house was extensively altered in the early 1900s with replacement siding, and perhaps even later by a replacement door, enclosed south porch and altered entrance. Yet it retains five leaded glass panels in the first-floor dining and living areas with hand-painted medallions at their centers. These go unmentioned in the survey [The Bergen County Historic Sites Survey], although they are visible from the street.

Walter Dewsnap was the son of James and Mary Jane Dewsnap of Saddle River. He married, in December 1893, in Brooklyn, Clara Thomas, daughter of George E. Thomas. They had a daughter, Vivian Dewsnap. He was in the real estate and insurance business, with an office on Liberty Street, in New York City in 1894, where he specialized in selling and insuring "farms and country seats among the hills and valleys of northern New Jersey."

45 Maple Street **Hopper-Dewsnap House** Block 1809, Lot 7 (Old Block 35, Lot 75) Walter Dewsnap was living in Allendale by 1893-94. He served on Allendale's first borough council in 1894 and the first recorded council meeting on December 18, 1894 was held at his home. He served as Mayor of Allendale for the longest period of time of any Mayor until 1959, beginning in 1901 through 1905, and then again in 1910 and 1911. (Robert I. Newman served as Mayor from 1959-1966, becoming the longest-serving Mayor of Allendale.)

In 1894 Dewsnap was living in the "Smith cottage," whose site is unknown (there were several "Smith houses" in Allendale at this time). In 1895, he bought the "John Hopper House," today's 45 Maple Street. By August 1903 he had moved into the house at 256 Franklin Turnpike. Walter Dewsnap's brother, William Dewsnap, of Allendale, was an architect, having graduated from Pratt Institute; it is possible that he designed, very early in his career, the house at 256 Franklin Turnpike.

Dr. Charles W. Badeau and his wife, Louise (or Louisa) E. Badeau came to Allendale about 1876, first buying the property at 46 Maple Street, which is shown as Lot #31, labelled "Dr. Bedeau" on the "Map of the Property of John L. Yeomans" surveyed March 1886 and filed May 5, 1886. By April-May 1879, Badeau had bought the house at 232 Franklin Turnpike from Aaron Ackerman (Hackensack Republican, April 24, 1879; ibid. May 8, 1879).

Charles W. Badeau was born about 1844. He was the brother of General Adam Badeau, who fought in the Civil War and was 'the well known author of General Grant's memoirs." Adam Badeau summered at Allendale in 1892, and in the fall of that year bought 'the Alfred Ackerman place." He died about 1895.

Dr. C. W. Badeau was an active physician, a Trustee of the

Dr. C. W. Badeau was an active physician, a Trustee of the Orvil Co-operative Building and Loan Association, and an amateur photographer. He was appointed Board of Health Commissioner by the Allendale Borough Council in February 1896. In 1901 he retired and moved to Passaic, N.J., where he spent his summers, and Dunedin, Florida, where he spent his winters. He died on January 3, 1918 at Dunedin.


After its transfer in December 1913 from B. F. Hutches to the Roman Catholic Diocese of Newark, the house was transformed into a chapel. *The Ramsey Journal* of December 3, 1913 reported: "The house which was recently purchased from Mr. B. F. Hutches is being transformed into a Catholic Church and services will likely be held in the new place of worship on Christmas Day."

On December 19, 1913 The Ramsey Journal reported: "The new Catholic Church of Allendale will be opened for service on Christmas day. The church, the name of which will not be announced until next week, is a mission of the parish of St. Luke, Hohokus. Services have been held since September in the gymnasium over the garage of H. J. Appert. Recently the residence of B. F. Hutches on Maple Place was purchased and has been extensively remodeled so that there will be a seating capacity for 125 on the first floor and rooms for Sunday school and parish purposes on the second floor. Extra columns have been placed under the first floor so that the increased weight of many people will be provided for."
