





This house was probably built by Stephen Van Blarcom and sold in early 1884 to Charles L. Parigot. The Bergen County Democrat on February 22, 1884 reported under the Allendale heading: "There is a brisk demand for real estate. W. E. Switzer has effected the sale of the property of Stephen Van Blarcom to C. Parrigot, of Yonkers, N.Y "

In the summer of 1900, the Parigots had a new house built for them on East Allendale Avenue. and leased this house to Dr. G. H. Parkhurst for 3 vears.

Charles L. Parigot was born in Bahia, Brazil about 1846. He moved from Yonkers to Allendale in 1884 and lived here until his death in August 1917. He was elected a Trustee of the Orvil Cooperative Building and Loan Association in April 1889, and served as a Borough Councilman on Allendale's first council, elected in 1894. He was interested in the Bergen Guard of Allendale and attended and participated in the group's drills and hikes. He was a charter inactive member of the Allendale Fire Association. He and his wife had a son, George W. Parigot who ran a real estate business.

William George Z. Critchley, the son of William George Critchley and Mary Stewart, was born August 15, 1879 (1878?) in Brooklyn, and died November 26, 1947. He came to Allendale in 1913 and was very active in civic affairs in the Borough. He was a member of the Borough Council for 8 years, was active in the Allendale Fire Department, signed the certificate of incorporation of the Allendale Library in 1923, was a Director of the Allendale Building and Loan Association, was a founder of the Allendale Holiday Observers, and was Postmaster of Allendale for 15 years. He and his wife, Ella Von Seyfried Critchley, had two sons: Norman G. Critchley (m. Margaret Rossiter) and Elwood T. Critchley (m. Marion Booth).


This house at 42 Powell Road was built for Kate Harris after she had sold her previous home on Franklin Turnpike to Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Pritchett in the summer of 1900. On August 2, 1900, the *Hackensack Republican* reported: "Mrs. Harris as soon as plans are completed, will commence to build on the lot next to the Powell place, and will erect a large, handsome villa, differing architecturally from anything in the neighborhood." In May 1901, the *Hackensack Republican* reported: "Mrs. Katherine Harris and her daughters are installed in their new home and have one of the prettiest houses in town. The house is most artistic, and a great addition to the borough."


Katherine Powell married Alfred W. Harris on October 2, 1873. They had three daughters, Ethel, Mary and Adele. Alfred Harris died sometime between 1880 and 1882. Mary Harris was born in the old Powell homestead, and lived with her mother at 42 Powell Road at the time of her marriage to William Dewsnap on June 25, 1902. The *Hackensack Republican* reported that "...after their return from the honeymoon trip they will make their home with Mrs. Kate Harris."

William Dewsnap was born in Saddle River, the son of James and Mary Dewsnap, and was an architect, a graduate of Pratt Institute.
