
We'd like to take this opportunity to salute the dedicated people who serve as league directors in our organization.

2. TEAM PICTURE DAY: A photo session to be scheduled for opening day of Baseball, Softball, Kickball Season (Details to follow).


3. Step up our team sponsorship program. It is our goal to obtain a sponsor for every Baseball/Softball/ Kickball team formed.

The upcoming basketball season promises to be one of the best ever. More than 300 boys and girls in grades 3 to 8 registered for this year's season. The season is planned to run until mid March.

Each year, the Allendale Recreation Commission looks for ways to enhance its programs while building upon previous strengths. Basketball, this year, is no exception. We will continue to integrate the basketball programs of Allendale and Upper Saddle River - feedback received last year was very positive. More and better equipment will be provided this year. Also, through the efforts of Mr. Morton and Mr. Conrad, additional gym time has been secured at both Brookside and Northern Highlands. This will open up blocks of time for rescheduled games and provide extra practice time. Most importantly, the Commission is dedicated to increasing the quality of coaching. Last year a commitment was made to provide a standardized training program for all volunteer coaches. A nationally recognized program offered by the National Youth Sports Coaches Association was selected to certify our coaches. Basketball is the last sport to have its coaches trained. All coaches will be required to attend the certification training program.

Allendale "Town Night" with the New Jersey Nets was a success last year and an event certainly enjoyed by those of us who attended. The second Allendale "Town Night" with the New Jersey Nets has already been reserved. This year we will be seeing the Philadelphia 76ers led by Charles Barkley, the "Round Mound of Rebound," take on the Nets with their new and exciting look. The date is Tuesday night, March 26th. Excellent seats, at a discount price will be provided, but mark your calendars now!

Finally, the name of the game is FUN - fun for the kids and for the coaches. We urge all parents to participate in the fun. Come out and see your child play during the season - you'll have a great time.
