We're watching happily the progress on the renovation of the pre-Revolutionary Ackerman-Rozmus house on Franklin Turnpike near the Waldwick border. The gunite exterior coating has largely been removed and the underlying original stone is being repointed. The stonework of this house is similar in age and style to that of the Old Stone House Museum in Ramsey.

Our Society continues to operate in an inactive capacity because we have no volunteers willing to serve as officers and chairpeople. The current officers (all of whom have served for a number of years) have accepted their positions on an inactive basis only, meaning that our only goals will be to continue to collect and store material pertinent to Allendale's history and heritage, and to publish this newsletter four times a year.






# ALLENDALE HOUSES BUILT BEFORE 1940

Compiled by Pat Wardell

Compiler's Note: This "inventory" of pre-1940 Allendale houses has been compiled using information in the Society's files and in my own files. Very few of the houses have been systematically researched, so we know that for most of them, the information is incomplete. We would welcome any additions, corrections, updating, etc. from our readers, and will happily add such information to the Society's files.

Only houses still in existence today are included in this inventory. Houses are generally named for the earliest known owner/occupant. Names associated with a house are not necessarily always owners; some may have been tenants. Also, not all owners actually lived in houses they owned; some houses were leased for rental income. The houses are listed alphabetically by street names, then numerically by house number.

In 1940 the house was described as a two story, frame house with a poured concrete foundation, clapboard exterior and a composition shingle roof. There was a garage, and the house had porches, a bay and two extensions. There were six rooms, including three bedrooms, and one half tile bath.




46 East Crescent Avenue Vanderbeck (?) House


This house was built in 1895 according to the Allendale Girl Scouts' Old House List (at the Allendale Public Library). At present its history until about 1940 is unknown. Perhaps it is the house marked "J. W. Vanderbeck" on the 1902 Robinson's map.

In December 1986 the house was listed for sale for \$234,900. In the listing it was described as a Victorian, three-bedroom, one and one-half bath, three story house with an aluminum exterior, a composition shingle roof and an open front and side porch.





Block 20A was apparently purchased from Wilson in December 1943.
