PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Ed Ducey 825-3293

As we begin the final year of our term, I would like to express my appreciation to a dedicated team of individuals who have worked so hard in a most unselfish way to complete the agenda that was established in September of 1989.

This agenda of goals included the establishment of a local chapter of the National Youth Sports Coaches Association to offer certification clinics for coaches. Certification is now mandatory for all coaches in the American Amateur Baseball Congress and the Northwest Bergen Soccer Association.

We have recruited a very special group of volunteers to assist in building a more effective organization in the areas of fields, equipment, NWBSA representation, and fundraising.

We have acquired federal and state status as a tax exempt organization due to the efforts of Jack Kilgallen.

Our editorial team has worked hard to publish a newsleter to better communicate with the K-8 parents of Allendale.

Our working relationship with USR-Hohokus-Saddle River in basketball, baseball, and softball is closely monitored and we have endeavored to iron out problems as they arise.

As stated in our first newsletter the renovation and maintenance of our playing fields was a high priority item. As of today, we can report Field #2 at Brookside has been renovated as a softball field. Jack Kilgallen can take a great deal of credit for the design and supervision of construction during this project which was completed in 5 days at the cost of under \$10,000, all of which was contributed by ARC's sponsor program.

We continue to negotiate with the Borough Council for a fiscally responsible approach to the presentation of other town fields. As meetings went on and on the ARC Board realized that the plans proposed by the Borough consultant were growing way out of proportion to the basic issues of safety and conservative spending that the ARC had originally proposed. The consultant's proposal once reached a high of \$1.4 million. We'd like to thank Richard Furfaro who stepped in, re-wrote the bid specifications and worked with the Council on the final proposal which resulted in the Borough's decision to renovate Fields #1, 3, 4, and 6 for a total of \$54,000. With work soon to begin on these fields, we will turn our attention to the improvements on the Brookside and Crestwood soccer fields.

The term of office of the current ARC Board ends in May of 1993. As stated in the by-laws, the President will appoint a Nominating Committee at the January General Meeting. This committee will present a slate of officers at the March General Meeting to be voted upon at the May General Meeting. Additional nominations of officers from the floor shall be permitted at the March meeting only.

Volunteers of the Allendale Recreation Commission work in many different capacities to serve the children of Allendale: from registration, to equipment distribution, to field maintenance, to the (sometimes impossible) job of collecting uniforms. Each parent volunteer contributes in some way for the betterment of the organization. We are most appreciative of everyone's help.

The objective of the Allendale Recreation Commission is to supervise a recreational sports program for the children of the town as opposed to sponsorship of select, competitive teams. ARC strives to maintain fair and open team selection with equal playing time for all children regardless of their ability. Our aim is to offer the children a meaningful, fair, and safe sports experience.
