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SOCIETY NEWS

On November 19th we held our first general meeting since April 1989 (after which the Society became inactive) at Fellowship Hall, Highlands United Presbyterian Church. We were very gratified to see so many members and friends in attendance (the room was filled to capacity).

Joann Hart and Judy McKim presented our updated slide show (a project they had worked on during the summer). The slide show displays Allendale views past and present and is loaned to schools and organizations without charge.

We are pleased to report that the book, "Allendale: Background of a Borough" is now out of print. A little history of the publication might be of interest to readers. The Society subsidized the book with \$2,000 from its funds raised in the 1970s and 1980s and another \$2,000 of the printing costs were paid for by donations from Society members and friends. This enabled us to sell the book for \$50 a copy (\$35 per copy for books that were sold at the discounted price offered to those who sent money before the book was published). The research, writing, design, and typesetting were all done by Pat and Walt Wardell, who volunteered their time and work. 400 copies were printed (more than half were sold through our prepublication offering). There are no plans to reprint the book at this time, so if you own a copy, it's now a "collector's item"! We thank all those who supported our efforts, and all those who bought the book.

We encourage anyone who wishes to help reactivate the society to call Judy McKim (201-825-3553) to volunteer. We need help in the following categories: membership chairman, catalogers to volunteer for sorting, arranging and cataloging our collection; photographers -- of present sites in town; and for photographing ("copying" as slides) some of the old photographs in our collection. We also need a volunteer to fill our third trustee slot.

We thank all our members who sent in dues for their loyal support. If you haven't yet sent your dues, we remind you to please do so now.

This newsletter includes some photographs of the 1945 flood in Allendale, and we've included an image of the envelope containing the processed photos -- the envelope itself, from Temperlyn's Pharmacy, is now a piece of Allendale's history! The pictures were provided to us by Walter Hillman of Arizona, whose mother, Alice Megnin, took the photographs.

Gaile Dargue Canfield sent some Allendale School photos in which her father appears, and these will be reproduced in this and the next few newsletters. Our faithful supporter, Helyn ("Tiny") Anthony Meyer, who now lives in Longboat Key, Florida helped to identify those in the photographs.

In this issue we're also reproducing some cards and letters sent to members of the Doolittle family in the early 1940s. These will bring back many memories for those involved with the Allendale Fire Department.

In an upcoming newsletter, we will publish photographs of the Joseph Warner Allen monument and the Allen family plot in the cemetery adjacent to the Christ Episcopal Church in Bordentown, NJ. These photos were taken for us by William Walling, who has family ties to Bergen County. Mr. Walling now lives in Bordentown, and we "met" him on the internet, while doing genealogical research. Ah, the serendipity of modern technology and the world wide web!

As always, we encourage members and others to write their memories of Allendale and Allendale events, places and people and send them to us to be published as future newsletter articles. It's easy to forget that our own lifetimes are part of history -- do you have memories of Allendale in the 30s, 40s, 50s, 60s -- do you recall some unforgettable Allendale people, events, and landmarks? What was daily life in Allendale like then? How was it different from life today? Has something you've read or seen in our newsletter stirred your memories? We often receive notes and letters from readers telling us how much they enjoy reading the recollections of others. Won't you jot down a few notes for us? ■

ALLENDALE HOUSES BUILT BEFORE 1940

Compiled by Pat Wardell

Compiler's Note: This "inventory" of pre-1940 Allendale houses has been compiled using information in the Society's files and in my own files. Very few of the houses have been systematically researched, so we know that for most of them, the information is incomplete. We would welcome any additions, corrections, updating, etc. from our readers, and will happily add such information to the Society's files.

Only houses still in existence today are included in this inventory. Houses are generally named for the earliest known owner/occupant. Names associated with a house are not necessarily always owners; some may have been tenants. Also, not all owners actually lived in houses they owned; some houses were leased for rental income. The houses are listed alphabetically by street names, then numerically by house number.

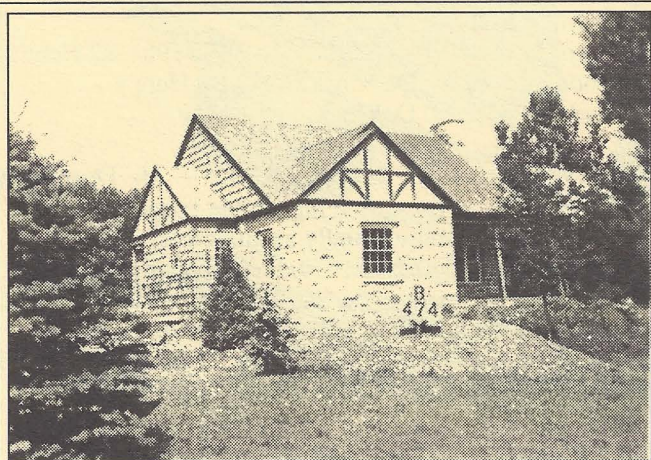

In 1940 the house was described as a new frame one-story bungalow on a 60 x 248 foot lot. There were no outbuildings. The house was built on a concrete block foundation, and had a wood shingle and stone exterior, with a composition shingle roof. There were five rooms, including two bedrooms and one half-tiled bath. There was a finished basement with laundry area.

In 1951 a new garage and breezeway was built, and in 1953 an addition was added to the kitchen.

There was a 31-foot x 31-foot porch, a rear extension, and bays.

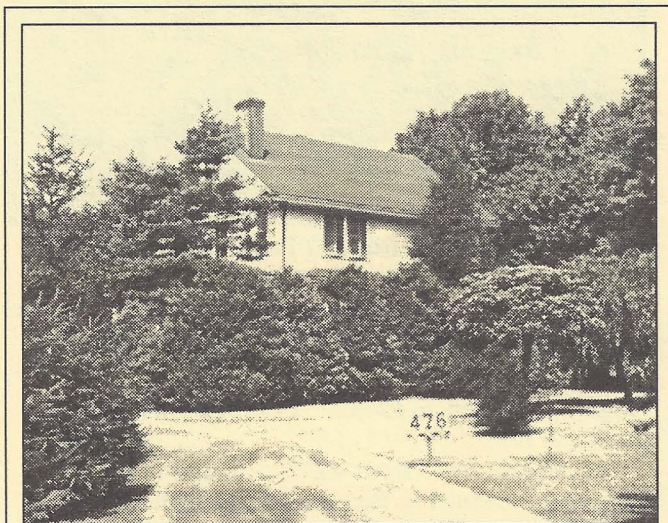

In 1940 the house was described as a 25-year-old two and-a-half story, one-family frame dwelling on a 100 x 249-foot lot. It was built on a stone foundation, had a wood shingle exterior, and a composition shingle roof. There was an extension, three bays, and three open porches. There was separate garage. The house had eight rooms, including four bedrooms and one wood and plaster bath.

The house was offered for sale in 1985 with an asking price of \$198,500. The listing noted 5 bedrooms, a fireplace in the living room, a screened porch, and a modern kitchen. There was a window seat in the living room and a leaded glass panel in the front door.



Louis E. Jones was born in New York State about 1872 and died before 6 December 1961. He married Alice May Cutler. She died in May 1955 and was buried at Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn, NY.

Jones was a department manager for a New York underwriter company. He was a member of the Publicity Committee of the Allendale Christmas Tree Association in 1917 and charter treasurer of the Allendale Garden Club in 1921. He was a director (1900) and president (1926) of the Orvil Co-operative Building & Loan Assn.

672 Franklin Turnpike Drummond House

— 31 March 1899, *Ramsey Journal* — Mr. Drummond purchased one of those fine lots on the Ivers tract and there are several more equally as attractive.

— 20 June 1901, unidentified newspaper [clipping from Bertha Blauvelt of Saddle River scrapbook] — The Drummond house on the hill will be one of the finest in town when completed. It commands a fine view, and can be seen from the Saddle River Road.

— July-Aug 1908, *The Parish Messenger* [Church of the Epiphany] — The property of Mr. F. Drummond located on the turnpike, consisting of five acres of good meadow land, large house with all modern improve-

ments, is now on the market for sale.



Frank L. Drummond was born about August 1864 in New York State. He married Anna E. Smith, who had been born in September 1864 in Pennsylvania. She died in June 1915. They had a son, Frank Holdon Drummond, who was born about November 1900 and graduated from the Allendale School 18 June 1914.

They lived at 672 Franklin Turnpike in a house built in 1901 on a lot bought from Ivers. They were members of the Epiphany Episcopal Church in 1913.

Anna Smith Drummond was one of the group of women who started the Allendale Library in 1900.

Living with them in 1900 was Lucy W. Goodrich, a servant, b. Dec 1840 NY, a widow in 1900. Living with them at the time of the 1910 Federal Census was Mary Smith, mother-in-law, 72, widow, mother of six children, four of whom were then living.

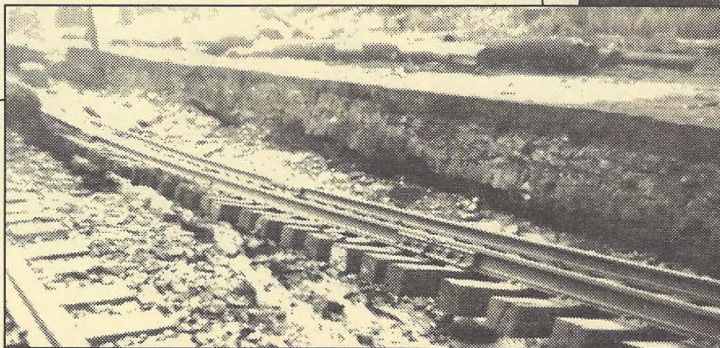
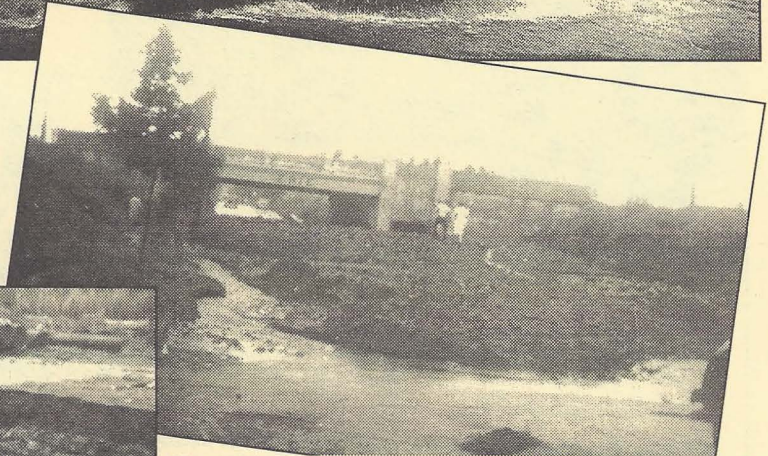
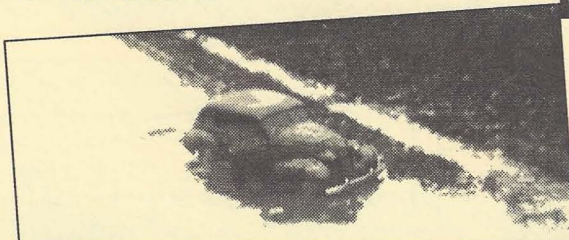

The July 23, 1945 Flood

After a week of steady rain, on Sunday, July 23, 1945 the dams at the Ramsey Country Club Estates in Ramsey and Crestwood Lake in Allendale broke, releasing torrents of water through Allendale. These photos record some of the devastation. Bottom, washed out RR tracks near Crescent Avenue. On Crescent Avenue, a car had been covered by the flash flood waters.
