**Captain O'Connor Itemizes Work Of Volunteer Organization For Past Year---17 Out-of-Town Patients Transported To Hospitals; \$45 Collected  
---Mobilization Test Is Successful**

A busy year of service to the community has been summed up in the annual report of Captain Paul O'Connor, in which he itemized the activities of the Allendale Ambulance Corps. The report will be submitted to the Borough Council at the next meeting.

To Mayor and Members of Council;

The following is the yearly report of the Captain of the Allendale Ambulance Corps for the year ending December 31, 1938.

During the year the Corps responded to the following number of calls:

January-2, Feb.-6, March-4, April-7, May-3, June-1, July-11, August-5, Sept.-6, Oct.-8, November-2, Dec.-5. For a total of sixty calls.

Total number of patients administered to were 64.

Number of calls from Allendale 43, Ramsey 5, Waldwick 4, Saddle River 4, Ho-Ho-Kus 2, Midland Park 2.

During the year we answered two calls where our service was not required. Since organization, we have answered a total of 78 calls.

Types of calls were: Blood Transfusions 7, Heart Attacks 2 Artificial respiration 2-16 men responded. Pneumonia 2, Maternity

5, Accident 3 injuries undetermined, First Aid Renditions 16, Broken Limbs 5, Spine injuries 5, 3 were broken vertebraes, Appendicitis 5.

The Corps collected \$45.00 which was turned over to Town Council during the past year.

I would like to draw to your attention the mobilization test conducted at the Recreation Park last August by the New Jersey First Aid Council. In twenty nine minutes six different corps assembled here with squads and equipment ready to perform service. Our membership in this council facilitates this additional protection in case of emergency. It was the first such test ever held in this state and perhaps the first such test held in the nation.

Our Corps has a roster of eighteen men at the present time.

During the coming year we hope to be able to make additional contributions to our equipment and thus be able to render a most valuable service to our community. The Corps is alive, the spirit is high and they are only too eager to serve.
