# ALLENDALE MAN'S FIRST AID LAUDED

## Booth, Who Acted Quickly After R. R. Accident, Credited With Life

Port Jervis, N. Y., Aug. 12—Physicians at St. Francis Hospital repeated the story today of first aid administered by an Allendale Ambulance Corps member that saved the life of a camper run down by a train, his legs sliced off.

The victim attempted to board a train at the station, slipped and fell between cars. The volunteer ambulance corps man arrived at the station just in time to hear horrified screams of commuters.

The Allendale first aid man, Kenneth M. Booth of West Maple Street rushed to the scene, called for stout pencils and handkerchiefs and used these improvised tourniquets to stop the surge of blood. When the ambulance arrived, the victim was ready to be moved.

Booth is an Erie conductor. Last Sunday he made his first run here in 1½ years. At Allendale he is instructing his fourth first aid class. He also conducted a Casualty Station refresher course. Booth is president of Allendale Fire Department.

He is 47 years old. For 25 years he has been railroading.
