

'Faithless Friend' Betrays Speeder

Herbert Hoffman of Clifton was fined \$20, with \$2.50 costs of court, by Recorder J. F. Rouault in Allendale Police Court Wednesday night, on a June 30 speeding charge, after being brought to court on a warrant when he failed to appear July 2 as summonsed.

As unnamed "faithless friend" who told him the ticket "would be fixed," was Hoffman's reason for disregarding the July 2 summons. He gave the friend the ticket and thought that ended it, he told Judge Rouault who's known for his phobia against "fixes" as well as for his impartial fairness to all offenders.

The charge, brought by Marshal Robert Finley was 60 m.p.h. on West Crescent Avenue, 12:30 a. m., June 30.

Raymond E. Knickel Jr., Mahwah Township, was fined \$5 and \$2.50 costs of court, for doing 50 miles an hour on West Crescent, between Brookside and Park Avenue, 10 p. m., July 3, on a summons by Officer Finlay

Fred Allan of Ramsey, summonsed by Ethel S. Douglas of Allendale, for damaging her car in backing from a parking spot on West Crescent Avenue during the American Legion Carnival, July 1, settled his differences with the complainant who charged \$30 damages to her car which had been driven by her son. Each party agreed to pay half of the expenses of repairs to the Douglas car. Sentence was suspended.
