The Recycling Corner ~ GREAT NEWS

Did you know The Borough was able to reduce its 2013 budget for tonnage on our garbage by \$25,000 because our RESIDENTS significantly increased their recycling?

Have a question on what's recyclable, email our recycling coordinator at Recycling@AllendaleNJ.gov, and ask! You may be surprised on how much can be recycled. The following is a list of common kitchen items that can be recycled:

- ✓ Styrofoam trays from meat & fish – rinsed.
- ✓ All egg cartons; Styrofoam goes into plastics recycling and paper/cardboard in cardboard recycling.
- ✓ Paper towel and toilet paper rolls into cardboard recycling.
- ✓ Most packing material from online orders; packing peanuts and plastic air bags into plastic recycling, thick packing paper in cardboard recycling.
- ✓ Plastic and Styrofoam take-out containers in plastic recycling.
- ✓ Packing material from cases of water, BUT please put plastic packaging in plastic recycling and cardboard bottoms into cardboard recycling!

We'll keep listing items that come in as questions from our recycling coordinator and hope in 2014 we can reduce our tonnage by another 10%, go Allendale!

New Siren in Town

If you hear a strange siren sound around town, it is probably our new lightning detection system. A Lightning Detection System has been installed in Allendale!

We no longer have to guess when it is safe to go back into the lake or back onto the fields.

Some basic guidelines:

- When lightning is within 5 miles sirens will go off for 18 seconds (will go off only once). Residents should move into a building or a car.
- Strobe light will start flashing and continue to flash the entire time the lightning is real.
- When no lightning is detected within 5 miles for 30 minutes from last strike, an "all clear" siren will sound for 18 seconds. This is a different sound than the alarm sound.
- At this time strobe will turn off and it will be safe to go back on the fields.
- Time off the field will vary with each storm. Average time is 45 minutes.
- There are no false alarms with this system.

You can register online beginning May 13th for Crestwood Lake. If you registered online last year for Crestwood Lake, **DO NOT DISCARD** your lake passes! They will be reactivated when you register this year. If you have a pass from last year follow directions below from the Borough website at www.allendalenj.gov under Crestwood tab.

2. Follow directions from #5 below. If you forgot your username/password, follow instructions to retrieve. If you still need help, contact Boro Hall at 201-818-4400.

If you are a new user to our system follow directions below from the Borough website at www.allendalenj.gov under Crestwood tab.

1. Click on the link: <http://register.communitypass.net/allendale>.
 2. Click on: Create your account now!
 3. Create User Name and Password.
 4. Enter Name of family Member, address, email (acct.Owner) Press Continue.
- Once you have created your account, then you log in**
5. Sign in using User Name and Password.
 6. Click on Register Now! Select Organization and scroll to Crestwood Lake .
 7. Verify Account Information. Add new parent/guardian if needed. Press Continue
 8. Add all family members. Press Continue.
 9. Pay online using Visa and Mastercard.
 10. All new members must get a new pass and photos taken.

If you do not have a computer, we will register for you at Borough Hall.

If you do not wish to use a credit card, paying by cash or check is also available in person by mailing to Allendale Boro Hall, 500 W. Crescent Ave., Allendale, NJ 07401. Attention Crestwood. You can still register online and choose the above method of payment. There are no refunds for lake registration.

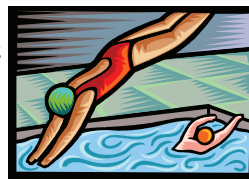


CRESTWOOD ENTRANCE
