
Infrastructure Trust Fund will allow us to start phase

one of the downtown improvement project this fall with the installation of new lighting. We've applied for phase two of the downtown improvement project and are hoping to start this construction in 2019.

The Water and Sewer Committee was able to negotiate a new agreement with SUEZ to operate our water system. This agreement will allow us to continue to insure our wells and water system are operated at the highest quality while being economically beneficial to Allendale. We've committed extensive funding to upgrading this very important infrastructure. We replaced and upgraded pumps in our wells and continue to look for ways to improve our distribution system. We'd like to remind residents that sump pumps must discharge into storm drains, not into any sink or drain inside the home. It is illegal to discharge sump pumps into our sewer system. Also, pools may not be filled using our water system from November – March.

Our Public Safety teams have been very busy this summer. The Allendale Volunteer Fire Department as well as our Police Department received valuable training on a property which will be torn down. They were able to simulate various scenarios for

> training purposes. The Allendale Volunteer Ambulance Corps has started their annual fund drive. I'd like to ask you to please be as generous to them as you can. As I hope you are aware both our



The Land Use Committee has been very busy with the ordinances needed to wrap up our agreement with the Courts on our affordable housing obligation. We are hopeful that our continued commitment to providing affordable housing will result in a judgement which will protect the Borough through 2025. We also expect to adopt an ordinance which will allow residents to sign up on a "No Knock" registry. This will prohibit salespeople, who must register with the Borough, from knocking on doors of residents who have signed up to be part of this program. Registered addresses will be provided with a self-adhesive sticker to be utilized near or on the front door. We also expect to adopt an ordinance prohibiting the sale of recreational marijuana in Allendale.



NEWS FROM THE BOROUGH ...

Message from the Construction Code Office Did you know...?

- That the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs says, "Final payment to the contractor is NOT required to be made before a final inspection is performed".
- It is recommended (but not required) that your contractor arrange and be present for all inspections.
- That if you do work without the required permit(s) your insurance company may deny any claim related to the unpermitted work.
- It is required that you close out all open permits. Don't wait before selling your house or another time-sensitive event forces the closure.
- All pools require proper fencing and all filters and equipment must be adequately screened from adjacent properties. See Allendale code 270-32.
- Temporary contractor signs are not permitted anywhere in Allendale.

The Mayor and Council adopted an ordinance requiring a permit for driveway expansion and replacement. The fee is \$100 and applications are available in the office or on our website www.allendalenj.gov.

Land Use Reminders

- You must obtain a tree permit when removing a trees 6 inches or larger in diameter.*
- A Certificate of Compliance is required if you are renting your home or apartment.*
- Letters to residents who still need to close open permits will be going out next week.

Selling your house?

A Certificate of Compliance (CCO), from Fire Prevention and Zoning is required for the transfer of tenancy and/or ownership of a property in the Borough of Allendale. The following items are part of the CCO inspection:

- Review of open permits
- Smoke/CO Alarms that are less than 7 years old
- · Home must have at least one fire extinguisher
- Pool fence will be inspected
- · Sidewalks will be inspected and if found inadequate, they must be repaired
- Sump pumps must discharge properly

The Mail-In Ballot application must be received by the County Clerk no later than seven days prior to the election if it is mailed or by 3 p.m. on the day prior to the election if the voter appears in person at the County Clerk's Office.

ALLENDALE FREE RABIES CLINIC

The Allendale Board of Health will be sponsoring a Free Rabies Clinic for dogs and cats on Saturday, November 3rd, 2018 between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. at the Ambulance Corps Building on the corner of Arcadia Road and Franklin Turnpike. A Veterinarian from the Allendale Animal Hospital has agreed to provide this service.

The Allendale Board of Health urges all residents to have their dogs, cats and other domestic pets vaccinated against rabies. Residents attending this clinic are required to have their pets in a carrier or on a hand-held leash.

SENIOR FLU CLINIC

The Borough of Allendale will offer influenza vaccinations to Allendale residents 65 years and older at Borough Hall on Thursday, November 1, 2018, 1:00-2:00 pm. Adults age 65 and over are required to bring their Medicare Card as well as any other insurance card they may have. Residents who are covered by a Managed Care Plan (HMO) are requested to go to the managed care provider for these immunizations.

If you are under 65 years old or have a chronic health problem, you must present a prescription from your medical doctor ordering the vaccine. Cost for this vaccine to be determined.

RECYCLING ALERT


Recycling Alert: The recycling industry is in a bit of a crisis. The market is rapidly changing and declining. Recycling markets were upended in 2017 when China announced it would stop accepting recyclables from the US and globally. The US is not equipped to handle the massive amounts of recycling material we produce. Currently the market value for glass, paper and plastic has severely declined and many recycle centers are processing recyclables at a loss. Some centers are stockpiling the materials or dumping them into landfills until there is a change in the industry.

What's happening now: Recycle centers are scrambling to retrofit their machinery for efficient processing. Until then we are still encouraging recycling the same way we have always been (with a few tweaks below). Especially since Allendale's recycling is up to 37% which is higher than the National average! It is important now more than ever to continue good practices that elevate sustainability and continue to preserve our environment.

Tips on how you can help continue and elevate sustainability:

• Use non-disposable bags when shopping. Stop by the Allendale Borough table on Allendale Day Oct 6th for a bag while supplies last.

• Use refillable water bottles.



• No plastic bags, plastic wrap, clothing, tanglers (cords & electronics) whatsoever in the recycle bins-they are not recyclable and clog up the machines.

• No food or liquids in plastic, metal or glass recyclables.

• Dirty recyclables can contaminate an entire load.

• For plastics: forget about the numbers on the bottom! Only recycle plastic bottles, jars, jugs and tubs (NOT... plastic single use items such as knives/forks, straws, solo cups, zip lock bags, shopping bags, plastic wraps or any Styrofoam).

Message from the Fire Chief



As you turn your clocks back, don't forget to change the batteries in your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors to keep your family safe!

Here are some other important tips to consider:

- Dust or vacuum your smoke/CO detectors when changing the batteries.
- Test alarms once a month using the test button.
- Replace the entire alarm if it's more than 7 years old, or doesn't work properly when tested.
- Install smoke and CO alarms on every level of your home, including the basement, kitchen area, and outside of bedrooms.
- Make sure everyone in your home understands what the warning sounds of the alarms are.
- Develop an escape plan that includes where everyone will meet outside and what to bring in case of an emergency.
- If an alarm sounds, dial 911 immediately.

If you smell or see smoke, exit your home and dial 911 immediately.

RECYCLING CENTER HOURS OF OPERATION

• Fall hours are Saturday 9am-5pm, Sunday 1pm-5pm through December 16.

• Winter hours begin December 22 to March 30, 2019.

Please be advised in the event of inclement weather, the Recycling Center will be closed. All paper and commingled recycling must be put in proper containers and must be loose.

**Remember: container cannot be larger than 30 gallons or weigh more than 60lbs for curbside pickup

COMPOST SITE HOURS OF OPERATION

The last weekend to use the Compost Area is December 15 and 16, 2018. The Compost Area will reopen in Spring 2019.

A Resident Compost Permit is needed. 2018 Permits are \$30 and can be purchased at Borough Hall. Check our website www.allendalenj.gov in March for 2019 schedule and permit information.

• Leaves are accepted loose or in brown bio-degradable paper bags.

• Grass is accepted loose only.

• Brush is accepted loose only, up to 4 inches in diameter

• No tree stumps or root balls are allowed.

• Dimensional wood – construction lumber, fencing landscape – is NOT allowed.

The Property Maintenance Officer reminds residents to:

Please...

• Do not put out trash or recycling (especially Bulky Trash), prior to 6pm the night before collection.

• Do not shovel, plow or blow snow from your property into the street.

• Sump pumps may not be discharged into the sewer system or into the street. If your sump pump has not been inspected and certified call Borough Hall to arrange an inspection. It is free of charge.

• Please remove styrofoam & other non-recyclable packing materials from cardboard boxes before putting curbside.
