RAMAPO CHAPTER TO DRIVE FOR \$9,900 IN MARCH

Ramapo Valley Chapter, American Red Cross will seek \$9,900. in the annual March Drive for Funds. Last year the Chapter goal was slightly less, but this year the increase will be needed to meet the growing demand for gamma globulin, a substance found in blood which helps prevent the paralytic effects of polio in children.

The Red Cross has been asked by the Federal government to expand its blood program to insure the greatest possible supply of gamma globulin to combat polio epidemics next summer. Gamma Globulin is a protein substance found in blood and has been tested and found effective in preventing the paralytic effects of polio in children.

Last year Ramapo Valley Blood program supplied over 600 pints to the Armed Forces; the National collection of blood being estimated at 4 million or more pints with 2,500,000 going to National Defense needs. Ramapo Valley's share seems but a drop, yet its collections rated well in the total program. There are 3,727 chapters which make up the National Red Cross. This year National is seeking at least one million pints more to help meet the growing demand for gamma globulin, which was tested in polio epidemics in 1952 in three American cities.

"At no time since the war years have the responsibilities of Red Cross been as great as they are today," George A. Witt, Chapter President said. "Its obligations to the armed forces, the National Blood Program, in Disaster Relief, and in training Americans in safety and health programs to protect themselves and neighbors in time of emergencies, are well defined. Red Cross is inseparably tied to the military and

**PITTIS ROAD POPS UP AGAIN AT BORO COUNCIL MEETING**

A letter of inquiry sent to the Mayor and Council recently by Mrs. Maude Pittis of Myrtle Ave. was answered by the Planning Board at the Borough Council meeting Wednesday night. Mrs. Pittis' letter stated that he husband Dr. Godfrey Pittis had complied with regulations in placing a curb on Pittis Road at the intersection of Myrtle Ave. which made the curb "unsightly and had caused her "embarrassment."

The Council voted to forward the reply from the Planning Board to Mrs. Pittis. It said in effect that the Planning Board regretted any annoyance Mrs. Pittis had suffered and assured her that once the opposite curb had been laid and the road resurfaced, she would be satisfied with the outcome.

The letter also pointed out that the only stultation the Planning Board had made was that the road be properly rounded. It further pointed out that the Borough Engineer, who was also engineer for Dr. Pittis, had complied with the regulations in the only manner he could in as much as it was the Planning Board's understanding that Dr. Pittis could not purchase the land on the north-east corner of the intersection, which would have enabled a straight curb to be put down.
