Job Loses First Round In Bout With Borough

One phase of Pat Job's legal action against the Borough Council and two councilmen for alleged injustices suffered at their hands over the matter of rezoning his Crescent Inn has met a rebuff.

Judge Hayden Proctor, in Newark Superior

Court, dismissed Mr. Job's Frank McCord and Helen Hanson on the basis that he had stated on "cause for action."

Mr. Job had charged Mr. McCord and Mrs. Hansen with voting in a prejudicial manner on a motion to rezone the tavern. He said they followed fore Judge Hayden that reresolution opposing the sulted in the ruling. a directive from the Republican Club, which had passed a change.

He had filed suit against the Borough Council and against Mr. McCord and Mrs. Hanson specifically. It was this latter and a clear slate on the charges part of the suit which was brough by Mr. Job. Both had thrown out of court.

not surprised by the ruling and that he had, in fact, expected it. But the seriousness with which he views his complaint was indicated by his statement that he was prepared to appeal the decision "right up to the LOCAL PEOPLE IN Supreme Court if necessary.'

It is thought that Mr. Job will first pursue his suit against the Borough Council, since the way is now open to Borough Attorney John Warhol to ask for a summary judgement on the same grounds on which Judge Proctor dismissed the suit against the two council members. This hearing will

Mr. Warhol confidently expect the suit against the borough to be dismissed in short order on the basis of the Hanson-McCord ruling.
