## GOP To Announce Council Candidate

The Republican Club has chosen its second candidate to run for the Borough Council in the November election, but is withholding the candidate's name until Wednesday night when a special meeting will be held at the firehouse.

President Dave Cooper said that this year the club is "all out to win" and promises a candidate that will carry the party to victory. He expressed confidence in the outcome of the election and said that the Republicans had learned through bitter experience that this year they must put on a full-fledged fighting campaign.

"Last year", Mr. Cooper said, "We did not go all out to get the information to the voters about our plans and party program. This year we will not repeat that mistake."

All regular members of the Republican Club have been notified of the meeting Wednesday night and all interested citizens have been invited to attend.

Mr. Cooper said that the meeting will be devoted to planning strategy and outlining the goals and potentials of the party.

The Republicans chose Lew Kort and Robert Thomas as their candidates for the election last Spring. Mr. Thomas, however, had to withdraw when he moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma. The candidate chosen to replace Mr. Thomas will be publicly presented at Wednesday's meeting.

Mr. Cooper said that his party is preparing a full program of carrying the issues to the people this fall and said he was fully confident that the Republicans would maintain their majority on the Borough Council.

"We are just warming up to win," Mr. Cooper said.

Some members are preparing to attend the next meeting of the Saddle River Planning Board to discuss the matter and perhaps forestall completion of the extension of Orchard Street.

It will be remembered that the much criticised Master Plan contained the suggestion that Orchard Street be cut through to Highway 17. So much criticism arose from residents of Orchard Street who did not want the road opened up, that the provision was taken out of the plan which was finally adopted by the Planning Board.

## MRS. L. P. EVERIST HONORED BY PRYTERIAN CHURCH

The West Nottingham Presbyterian Church has honored Mrs. LaBerta P. Everist for her years of service to the Junior Choir. A special commemorative plate has been placed on the piano in the auditorium of the church which was originally purchased for the use of the choir. Mrs. Everist was director of the choir from 1953 to 1950.

Mrs. Everist is the mother of Mrs. James Standing and lived in Allendale with her daughter and son-in-law the last few years of her life.

A few fallen trees have been dragged across the end of Orchard Street to provide a temporary barrier, but an area the width of a road has been cleared beyond the road block showing the course the road might follow.

The property from the end of Orchard Street to Route 17 is owned by Andrew Christopher of Saddle River. It is reported that Mr. Christopher intends to put through an improved road in order to sell building lots on either side.

Mr. Christopher did not have a permit from the Allendale Planning Board for building the road, and when questioned on this point, last Saturday by members of the Planning Board who went to investigate, he is reported to have said that he wasn't building a road, he was just clearing the land. However, it is known that he does intend to put through the road which crosses Highway 17 and extends through the borough of Saddle River. When Mr. Christopher is ready to begin work on the finished road, he will make application to the Planning Board, he said.

Members of the Allendale Planning Board are reported to be against extending the road which was cut through last weekend.

Boro Suffers Water Shortage

When the water pumps started pumping air yesterday morning one of the wells that supply the town, Commissioner Henry Cobb, on the advice of the water superintendent, issued the following order:

"No more lawn sprinklers are to be used until further notice." The Police have been instructed to see that the order is obeyed so that the supply of water, which is at a dangerously low level, will not be depleted any more than is necessary.

The present prolonged dry spell is eating into the town water supply at an alarming rate, informed sources report. At the present time the water pumps are working round-the-clock to supply the town needs.

A word of caution has been issued to all residents not to use excessive amounts of water. The supply appears to be adequate for the water needs of the borough, but the longer it stays hot and the longer the drought, the greater the danger of running short.

POOL OFFICIALLY CLOSED BY MAYOR

Mayor John Tucker announces that the Allendale swimming pool is officially closed for the season. The pool had been scheduled to close after Labor Day but the season was abruptly shortened last week.

Mayor Nelson Lumley of Waldwick said that no new cases had broken out in his borough and that all but one of the 7 victims would be sent home from the hospital shortly. He expressed satisfaction with the situation remaining status quo, and said that if no new cases broke out in the next week, Waldwick would soon be back to normal.

**MAHWAH MAY HAVE SEWER SYSTEM**

Mahwah residents may be in line for a sewer system which will be built as a joint venture with the Ford Motor Company and domestic waste disposal system in connection with their proposed new plant off Highway 17. The plant will be started next February.

The District Chief Engineer Bernard Kaplan of the Metropolitan State Health office in Newark has commended the Mahwah Board of Health for its interest in the construction of a joint sewer with the Ford Company.

The industrial waste system may also be constructed in the Borough of Ramsey.

Just how this independent sewer project will tie in with the proposed plans of the Sewer Authority for this area is not known at the present time because Mahwah's plans are still tentative. However, it is acknowledged that this new development will be taken into consideration in connection with the proposed area sewer development which Allendale will be asked to join.

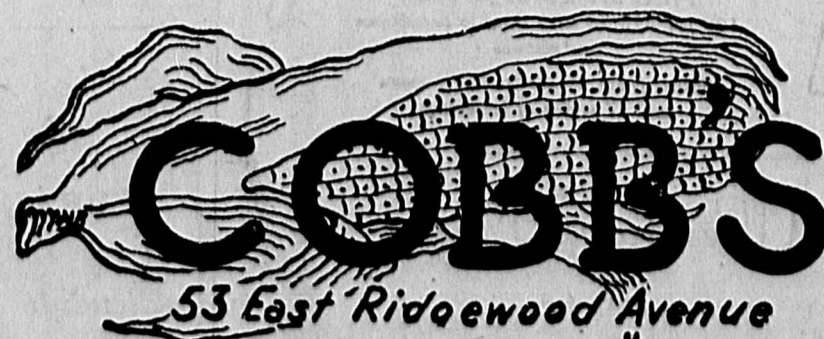

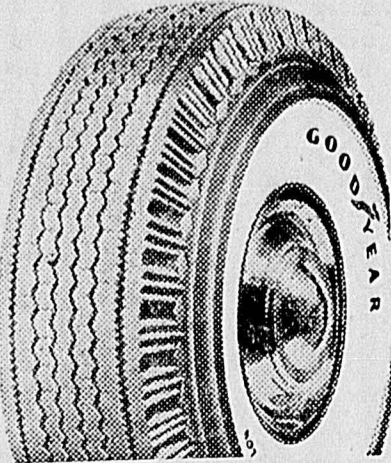

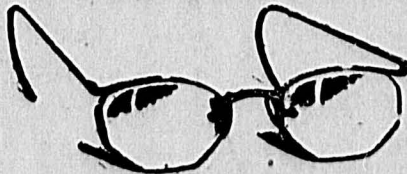
