#### **VOTERS SHOULD** CHEUN REGIST'ATION FUR SCHOOL ELEC.

Persons who wish to vote at the Annual School Election must either be permanently registered in the Signature Copy Register (Permanen Registration), or must do so between now and forty days prior to the date of the schoo. election date as indicated

All persons who are citizen. of the United States; who are twenty one years of age at the time of the school election who have resided one year in the State and five months in the county, and who are permanently registered in the district forty days (40 prior to the date of the election) may vote.

If you are not already regis. tered in the permanent registry lists, you may do so at the office your local Borough clerk or at the office of the County Board of Elections, Hackensack, N. J.

The Secretary of the Board of Education will not be able to register you; such registration must be done by your local municipal clerk or by the County Board of Elections. If you desire to register, please find out when your municipa! clerk is available. If you have any questions concerning your voting status, contact Alwyn Grossman, sec. retary of the Allendale Board of Education.
