At last the great day is almost here. Tomorrow the downtown area with its bright lights and Christmas music will be strangely quiet, for the people will be in their homes enjoying that curious American mixture of good fellowship and over indulgence.

The children will be out on the streets with their new bikes, roller skates and catcher's mits. Those with new skates and sleds will be watching the skies for signs of snow—and will be disappointed.

The churches have been crammed for the pre Christmas celebrations. Archer Church celebrated the lighting of the Scene of the Nativity last Sunday at 4 with a special service. VOTERS SHOULD CHECK REGISTRATION FOR SCHOOL ELEC.

Persons who wish to vote at the Annual School Election must either be permanently registered in the Signature Copy Register (Permanent Registration), or must do so between now and forty days prior to the date of the school election date as indicated.

All persons who are citizens of the United States; who are twenty one years of age at the time of the school election; who have resided one year in the State and five months in the county, and who are permanently registered in the district forty days (40 prior to the date of the election) may vote.

If you are not already registered in the permanent registry lists, you may do so at the office your local Borough clerk or at the office of the County Board of Elections, Hackensack, N. J.

The Secretary of the Board of Education will not be able to register you; such registration must be done by your local municipal clerk or by the County Board of Elections. If you desire to register, please find out when your municipal clerk is available.

STUDENTS HEAR STATE EDUCATOR

Miss Alice Meeker, Assistant Professor of Education and Chairman of the Department of Education at Paterson State Teachers College, addressed the college preparatory junior and seniors at the Ramsey High School last week. Miss Meeker's appearance is part of a State plan to recruit teachers for the expanded State Teachers College program and to meet the future great need for teachers in the public schools of New Jersey.

Miss Meeker suggested to those who were interested in teaching, that they should not consider that career unless they like children and people. Every child, she pointed out, has two parents and teachers must work in a community. She suggested that interested candidates babysit, take part in boy scout and girl scout activities and, if possible, teach a Sunday School class so that they would become more intimately acquainted with children.

BULB SNATCHERS STRIP MEMORIAL CHRISTMAS TREES

The two Christmas trees on the grounds of the War Memorial Building, have been stripped of 30 light bulbs, thus darkened this beautiful tribute for the holidays.

Lew Thurston, chairman of the decorating committee of the American Legion, said that the trees were decorated by the legion in honor of two servicemen who gave their lives in World War I. He expressed deep regret and some anger that vandals would deliberately steal the lights from the trees.

Police Chief Robert Wilson and Mr. Thurston said the persons who took the bulbs could not have been very young children who didn't know better, because lights were stolen from the top of the trees as well as the bottom. Every effort is being made to catch and apprehend the vandals.

FILE CHANGE OF ADDRESS WITH CLERK

Any person who is permanently registered in the County and who changes his residence from one municipality to another municipality must file or forward a change of residence at least forty (40) days prior to the date of the school election. This may be done only at the office of the municipal clerk or at the office of the County Board of Elections.

Francis X. Scafuro of W. Allendale Ave., a leader on the borough's civic affairs for many years, was named chairman of the International Trade Section of the New York Board of Trade in election conducted last week at the Board headquarters in New York City.

For the past 5 years Mr. Scafuro has been chairman of the Allendale Planning Board.

Mr. Scafuro, who is assistant vice president of the Bank of America serving in the international service section, succeeds Mr. Fred J. Emmerich, who became honorary chairman since 1950, when the wholly owned subsidiary Bank of America (International) was established. 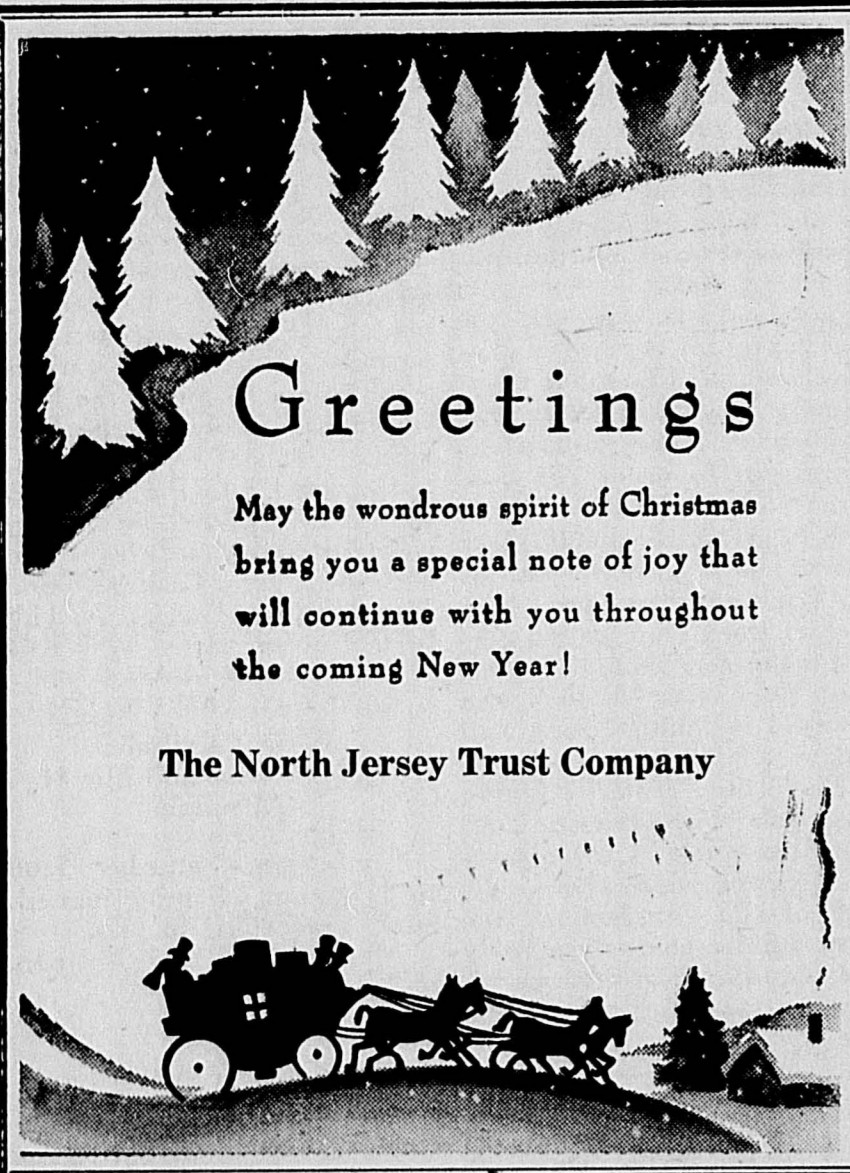

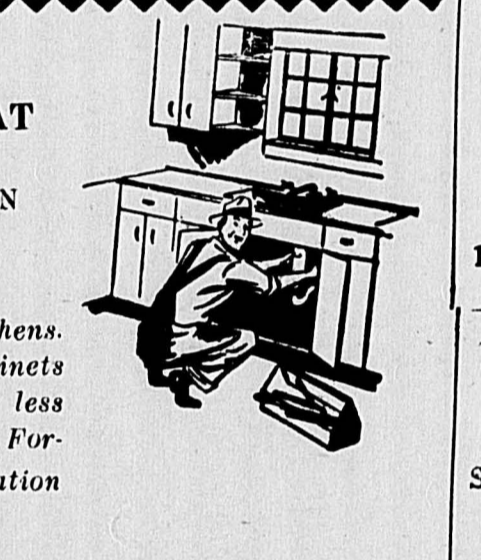
